10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 34-1-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

13 "\$34-1-4.

14 "(a) If each of the following qualifications is met, 15 the certificate of certified public accountant shall be 16 granted by the board to any person:

17 "(1) Who is a citizen of the United States or, if 18 not a citizen of the United States, a person who is legally 19 present in the United States with appropriate documentation 20 from the federal government, or has duly declared his or her 21 intent to become a citizen.

"(2) Who has attained the age of 19 years.
"(3) Who is of good moral character.
"(4) Who meets the following educational

25 requirements:

26 "a. A person shall have earned a college degree from
27 a four-year college or university accredited by a regional

1 accreditation board such as the Southern Association of 2 Colleges and Universities, with a concentration in accounting 3 or what the board determines to be substantially the 4 equivalent of a concentration in accounting. Persons who, on 5 May 16, 1989, have previously taken the uniform written CPA 6 examination shall be considered to meet these qualifications.

7 "b. After January 1, 1995, any person who has not previously sat for the uniform CPA examination shall have 8 completed a total of 150 semester hours or 225 quarter hours 9 10 of postsecondary education, including a baccalaureate degree or higher degree at a college or university accredited by a 11 12 regional accreditation board such as the Southern Association 13 of Colleges and Universities. The total education program 14 shall include an accounting concentration as defined by the 15 board and other course work as the board may require by 16 regulation.

17 "(5)a. Who has successfully passed a uniform 18 examination, administered by the board or its designee, in 19 accounting and auditing and in any other related subjects as 20 the board deems necessary, including, but not limited to, 21 business law and taxation, to maintain the highest standard of 22 proficiency in the profession of public accounting.

"b. After January 1, 1995, in order to be eligible for an initial sitting for the uniform CPA examination, a person shall have completed a total of 150 semester hours or 26 225 quarter hours of education, including a baccalaureate degree <u>or higher degree</u> at a college or university accredited

by a regional accreditation board such as the Southern
 Association of Colleges and Universities.

"(b)(1) Examinations provided for in this chapter
shall be given by the board as often as necessary, but not
less frequently than twice each year. The board shall, after
each examination, notify applicants of the results.

7 "(2) The board may issue certificates under the
8 signature and the official seal of the board, pursuant to this
9 chapter.

10 "(c) The board shall charge each person certified under subsection (e) and each candidate an application fee for 11 12 the uniform CPA examination in an amount determined by the 13 board. Examination and reexamination fees shall be charged by 14 the board, or its designee, in amounts determined by the board 15 for each subject in which a candidate is examined. The applicable fees shall be paid to the board, or its designee, 16 17 by the candidate at the time he or she applies for examination or reexamination. 18

19 "(d) Persons who, on May 16, 1989, held certified 20 public accountant certificates issued under the laws of this 21 state shall not be required to obtain additional certificates 22 under this chapter, but shall otherwise be subject to this 23 chapter. The certificates issued shall, for all purposes, be 24 considered certificates issued under this chapter and subject 25 to this chapter.

"(e) The board may waive the examination under
subdivision (a) (5), and may issue a certificate as a certified

1 public accountant to any person paying the application fee 2 provided in subsection (c) who possesses the qualifications specified in subdivisions (a) (1) through (a) (3), and what the 3 4 board determines to be substantially the equivalent of the applicable qualifications under subdivision (a)(4), and who is 5 the holder of a certificate as a certified public accountant, 6 7 then in full force and effect, issued under the laws of any 8 state.

9 "(f) The board may make appropriate regulations to 10 govern the issuance of a certificate as a certified public 11 accountant to the holder of a certificate, license, or degree 12 which is then in full force and effect in any foreign country 13 constituting a recognized qualification for the practice of 14 public accounting in the country, comparable to that of a 15 certified public accountant of this state."

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
