would increase criminal penalties for license violations or unlicensed practices.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 3 4 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 5 Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 6 7 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from 8 becoming effective with regard to a local 9 10 governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote 11 unless: it comes within one of a number of 12 specified exceptions; it is approved by the 13 affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates 14 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose. 15

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

Sections 34-21A-1, 34-21A-2, 34-21A-3, 20 21 34-21A-4, 34-21A-7, 34-21A-10, 34-21A-12, 34-21A-13, 22 34-21A-14, 34-21A-15, 34-21A-16, 34-21A-17, 34-21A-21, 34-21A-22, 34-21A-24, and 34-21A-25, Code of Alabama 1975, are 23 amended to read as follows: 24 "\$34-21A-1. 25 26 "The Alabama Onsite Wastewater Board is created to 27 examine, license, and regulate persons engaged in the

1 manufacture, installation, or servicing of onsite wastewater 2 sewage systems in Alabama. As more residences are built in rural areas where public sewer hookups and centralized 3 4 wastewater sewage treatment systems are often unavailable, many property owners must rely on onsite wastewater sewage 5 6 systems, such as septic systems, to handle residential waste 7 and wastewater sewage. The improper manufacture, installation, service, cleaning, and maintenance of onsite wastewater sewage 8 9 equipment and treatment systems can contaminate and pollute 10 the environment and pose significant harm to public health and 11 the rural environment. This board is created to establish the 12 qualification levels for those engaged in the manufacture, 13 installation, servicing, or cleaning of onsite wastewater 14 sewage systems and equipment in Alabama and promote the proper 15 manufacture, installation, and servicing of onsite wastewater 16 sewage systems.

18 "The following terms shall have the meanings 19 respectively ascribed to them as used in this chapter unless 20 the context requires a different meaning:

"(1) ALTERNATIVE ENGINEERED ONSITE WASTEWATER SEWAGE

conventional onsite wastewater sewage system equipment,
methods, processes, and installation procedures in accordance
with the rules and regulations of the Alabama Department of
Public Health.

1 "(3) CONVENTIONAL ONSITE WASTEWATER SEWAGE SYSTEM. 2 An onsite wastewater sewage system consisting of a septic tank, or an Alabama Department of Public Health approved 3 4 pretreatment device, with effluent discharging into a subsurface effluent disposal medium, where all portions of the 5 effluent disposal field sidewalls are installed below the 6 7 elevation of undisturbed native soil, including a conventional onsite sewage system as defined by the Alabama Department of 8 Public Health regulations. 9

10 "(4) GOOD STANDING WITH LOCAL HEALTH AUTHORITIES OR OFFICIALS. A person in good standing with local health 11 12 authorities or officials shall have had no substantiated 13 complaints filed against him or her with the local health 14 authorities or officials regarding the work of the person in 15 the onsite wastewater <u>sewage</u> industry, and shall be known by the local health authorities or officials to be a person who 16 17 abides by the rules and regulations of the Alabama Department of Public Health. 18

19 "(5) GREASE TRAP. A receptacle containing nontoxic, 20 nonhazardous liquid waste generated by a commercial food 21 operation or institutional food preparation facility 22 including, without limitation, fats, oil, grease, and food 23 scraps whether connected to a city sewer or not to include a 24 sewage tank, as defined by the Alabama Department of Public 25 Health regulations.

"(5)(6) INDIVIDUAL. A human person.

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"(6)(7) INSTALLATION. The act of installing a
 conventional or alternative engineered onsite wastewater
 sewage system.

4 "(7)(8) LICENSE. A valid and current certificate of
5 qualification issued by the board which shall give the named
6 person to whom it is issued authority to engage in the
7 specialized area and level of qualification described on the
8 certificate.

9 "(8)(9) LICENSEE. A qualified individual holding a
10 license issued by the board.

"(9)(10) LICENSING PROCEDURE. The process of testing at the state level to determine the knowledge and skill of an individual with respect to onsite wastewater sewage systems, and the issuing of licenses to indicate that an individual has passed the examinations and met all other board-established qualifications for licensure.

22 "(11)(12) MANUFACTURER. Person engaged in the 23 production of septic tanks or receptacle equipment used in 24 onsite wastewater sewage systems.

"(12)(13) ONSITE WASTEWATER SEWAGE SYSTEM. Any
 system of piping, treatment devices, pumps, alarms, or other
 facilities or devices that carry or convey, store, treat, or

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dispose of sewage (human waste) where the system is not connected to a public sewer, including an onsite sewage treatment and disposal system onsite septic system (OSS) as defined by the Alabama Department of Public Health regulations.

"(13)(14) RESPONSIBLE CHARGE. The direction or 6 7 supervision, or both, of projects involving the manufacture, 8 installation, cleaning, servicing, repairing, or maintaining 9 of onsite wastewater equipment or systems. The person in 10 responsible charge must direct the projects involving the installation or service and repair of an onsite sewage system 11 12 under Alabama law. The person in responsible charge must be a full-time employee, owner, partner, or a corporate officer of 13 the partnership, corporation, business trust, or other legal 14 15 entity. The person in responsible charge must possess the required skill, knowledge, and experience and have the 16 17 responsibility to supervise, direct, manage, and control the installation, service, or repair activities of the business 18 entity with which he or she is affiliated. The board may 19 examine the technical and personal qualifications of the 20 21 person in responsible charge and may investigate and/or 22 examine the person's gualifications.

"(14)(15) SERVICING. The act of cleaning,
 maintaining, or repairing an installed onsite wastewater
 sewage system.

"(a) There is established the Alabama Onsite 1 2 Wastewater Board. The board shall consist of nine members who shall, at the time of appointment and during the entire time 3 4 for which appointed, be residents and citizens of Alabama. The initial appointments to the board shall be effective October 5 1, 1999, with required licensing beginning January 2000, or as 6 7 soon as possible thereafter. Of the nine members of the board, three members shall be appointed by the Governor, three 8 members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, and 9 10 three members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Alabama Legislature. 11

12 "(b) Of the three members appointed by the Governor, 13 one shall be actively engaged in the business of installing 14 onsite wastewater sewage systems and shall serve an initial 15 term of two years. 1 Department of Public Health. Subsequent appointees Appointees to these positions on the board shall be licensees of the 2 board or have ownership in a business employing a designated 3 4 licensee in a position of responsible charge. The appointments and successor appointments by the Governor shall be made from 5 a list of recommendations submitted by the governing board of 6 7 the Alabama Onsite Wastewater Association, which list of recommendations shall include three individuals recommended 8 9 for each board position.

10 "(c)(1) Of the three members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, one member shall be actively engaged in 11 12 the business of manufacturing septic tanks and shall serve an 13 initial term of four years, and one member shall be actively 14 engaged in the business of installing onsite wastewater sewage 15 systems and shall serve an initial term of four years. Each of 16 these two initial appointees shall: Hold a current voluntary 17 certification from the Alabama Department of Public Health or have ownership in a business employing a designated person in 18 19 a position of responsible charge holding such a certificate, 20 have been involved in their respective business for five 21 consecutive years, and be in good standing with their local 22 county health authorities and the Alabama Department of Public 23 Health. submitted by the governing board of the Alabama Onsite 1 Wastewater Association, which list of recommendations shall 2 include three individuals for each board position. 3 "At the end of the term of the board member serving 4 in the septic tank manufacturing position following the 5 effective date of this <u>amendatory act</u>, <u>subsequent appointments</u> 6 7 to that position shall be to either: "A person licensed by the board; or a person having 8 ownership of a business employing a person who meets all of 9 10 the following requirements that he or she: Is in a position of responsible charge, provides or rents onsite toilet systems or 11 12 portable toilet systems, is licensed by the board, has been involved in his or her respective business for five 13 consecutive years, is in good standing with the local health

15 authorities and the Alabama Department of Public Health. Subsequent appointees to the onsite system installer position 16 17 shall be either: A licensee of the board; or a person having ownership in a business employing a designated licensee in a 18 position of responsible charge. 19

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"(2) The Lieutenant Governor shall also appoint a 20 21 member actively engaged in the development of a training or 22 educational program or instruction in environmental 23 protection, preferably experienced in the area of the wastewater sewage industry, and this member shall serve an 24 25 initial term of three years. This member shall: Have a minimum 26 of six years experience in the stated area of educational 27 expertise, be in good standing with his or her professional or regulating boards, and possess a reputation of high standards
 within the academic community.

"(d)(1) Of the three members appointed by the 3 4 Speaker of the Alabama House of Representatives, one member shall be an environmental engineer with training in the onsite 5 6 wastewater sewage industry, be experienced in and have an 7 understanding of the design and construction of onsite wastewater sewage systems, and be in good standing with the 8 Alabama Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land 9 10 Surveyors. This member shall serve an initial term of four 11 years and shall be appointed from a list of three 12 recommendations provided by the Alabama Board of Licensure for 13 Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors.

"(2) The Speaker of the House shall also appoint one member who has been actively involved for a minimum of three years in the onsite wastewater sewage inspection process and the regulation of onsite wastewater sewage systems and is employed by a local county health department or the Alabama Department of Public Health. This member shall serve an initial term of four years.

"(3) The Speaker of the House shall also appoint a member who is a consumer who will represent the public at large and who has an interest in the onsite wastewater sewage industry. The consumer member may not be engaged in or otherwise connected with any person or firm or corporation or business dealing with the onsite wastewater sewage industry and shall serve an initial term of four years.

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"(e) Upon the expiration of the initial terms of 1 2 office, and thereafter, all members appointed to the board shall serve four-year terms, or until their successors are 3 4 appointed. Their successors, who shall be appointed by the same respective appointing authorities and shall possess the 5 6 same respective qualifications as required for the initial 7 appointees, shall each serve not more than two consecutive terms of office. The membership of the board shall be 8 inclusive and the appointing authorities shall consider the 9 10 racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state in making their appointments. 11

"(d) A license shall be issued for the current 26

calendar year and the license shall be valid only for that

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calendar year. All licenses shall expire on December 31 of
 each calendar year.

"(e) No individual, business, partnership, or 3 4 corporation shall engage in the manufacture, installation, servicing, cleaning, or maintenance of an onsite wastewater 5 sewage system installed in the State of Alabama unless the 6 7 individual, or the person in responsible charge for the business, partnership, or corporation, has received the 8 required specific license from the board. "(q) No official charged with the duty of issuing 3 4 business licenses to any individual, partnership, corporation, or other business entity to operate a business performing the 5 function of manufacturing, installing, cleaning, servicing, 6 7 repairing, or maintaining onsite wastewater sewage equipment or systems in Alabama shall issue such a business license 8 unless there is presented for inspection a license certificate 9 10 as provided herein issued by the board to the individual or to some person in responsible charge with the partnership, 11 12 corporation, or business entity.

13 "(h) No license shall be issued except to an 14 individual. A firm, partnership, association, or corporation 15 shall not be licensed. Partnerships, corporations, or other business entities shall designate the licensed individual in 16 17 responsible charge under whose name its business is to operate to the local business licensing authority, the board, and the 18 local health officials. If that designated person ceases to be 19 employed by the business entity, notice shall be made 20 21 immediately to the board and the local health officials. The 22 partnership or corporation shall then have 45 days to 23 re-designate a licensed individual responsible for work 24 performed by the business entity. During this 45-day period, 25 no work shall be initiated by the business entity without the knowledge and approval of local health officials. Any work 26 27 performed during this time shall be inspected by local health

1 officials and approved by the officials before being 2 considered complete and put into operation. Under special circumstances, a business entity engaged in the manufacture of 3 4 septic tanks can petition the board for an extension of time beyond the 45-day period to re-designate a licensed individual 5 6 in a position of responsible charge under whose manufacturer's 7 license the business is to operate. Under no condition may this extension of time extend more than three weeks past the 8 date of the next examination offered by the board for a 9 10 manufacturer's license.

"(i) License certificates suitable for framing, bearing the licensee's name, level and type of license, license number, and the calendar year in which the license is valid shall be issued to all qualified licensees. Every licensee holding a license issued by the board shall display it in a conspicuous manner at his or her principal place of business.

18 "(j) All licensees shall abide by all federal, 19 state, and local laws and ordinances. No license issued by the 20 board may be sold or transferred. Any license misused may be 21 revoked by the board.

"(k) Every licensee shall notify the board of the address of his or her place of business, the counties in which he or she does business or performs work, and the name under which the business is carried on. Licensees shall give immediate notice to the board of any change in this information. Service of any process shall be achieved by

mailing notice of such information by first class postage, 1 U.S. Postal Service, to the address of record. No further 2 service of process shall be required. 3

"(a) All applicants for licenses, examinations, or 5 6 license renewals shall be required to complete specific 7 application forms developed and provided by the board. Information required to be provided on license application 8 forms shall include, but not be limited to, the following: 9

10 "(1) The applicant's name, date of birth, social security number, residence address, telephone number, and 11 12 county of residence.

"(2) The name of the applicant's employer, or the 13 name of the applicant's business, including the business 14 15 address and telephone number of the employer or applicant's business. 16

17 "(3) Names of all counties in which the applicant intends to perform work in the onsite wastewater industry. 18 19

"(4) Names and addresses of character references.

"(c) All required fees and documentation shall 5 accompany any application form filed with the board. 6 7 "(d) The board shall approve or deny all 8 applications for licenses and check applications for accuracy and completeness. The board shall notify the candidate of his 9 10 or her acceptance as a candidate for licensure and advise him or her of the date and location of the next scheduled 11 12 examination for the requested license. The board shall approve through its executive director the issuing of a license to 13 each applicant meeting the qualifications as set forth by the 14 15 board, or deny a license to each applicant not meeting the qualifications as set forth by the board. 16 17 "\$34-21A-14. "(a) The board shall develop eligibility 18 requirements to be met by applicants seeking licensing by the 19 board. The minimum application requirements shall include, but 20 21 are not limited to, the applicant's: 22 "<del>(1) Character.</del> 23 "(2)(1) Business experience. 24 "(3)(2) Work experience in the requested area of 25 licensure. 26 "(4)(3) Completion of training requirements as 27 established by the board.

4 "(b) The board shall develop the qualifications and
5 requirements relating to the manufacturer's license, which
6 shall include, but not be limited to:

9 "(3) Passing an inspection of the manufacturing 10 plant by a member of the board or some other person designated 11 by the board to perform manufacturing plant inspections.

17 "(a) No license shall be issued by the board without 18 examination of the applicant for the purpose of ascertaining 19 his or her qualifications for such work, except those licenses 20 issued pursuant to Section 34-21A-17. No examination shall be 21 required for the timely annual renewal of a current license.

"(b) The board shall offer and provide examinations which test the knowledge, skill, and qualifications of the applicants.

"(c) The board may charge each applicant a
reasonable fee for the examination based on the actual costs
of administering the examinations.

"(d) The board shall establish dates and locations

"(b) Whenever it appears to the board that an
individual has violated or is about to violate this chapter,
it may in its own name petition the circuit court of the

county where the violation is occurring or is about to occur 1 2 to issue a temporary restraining order or other appropriate injunctive relief enjoining the violation. 3 "(c) The board may reprimand in writing any licensee 4 who provides substandard or dangerous service, repair, or 5 installation or who otherwise violates this chapter. 6 7 "(d) The board may levy and collect an administrative fine not to exceed one thousand dollars 8 (\$1,000) for each violation of this chapter or a rule or 9 10 regulation, as amended, of the Alabama Onsite Wastewater Board or Alabama Department of Public Health rules pertaining to the 11 manufacture, installation, servicing, cleaning, or maintenance 12 of an onsite sewage system or portable toilets. 13 "(e) In addition to or in lieu of the criminal 14 penalties and administrative sanctions provided in this 15 chapter, the board may issue an order to any person, firm, or 16 corporation engaged in any activity, conduct, or practice 17 18 constituting a violation of this chapter directing the person, firm, or corporation to immediately cease and desist from the 19 activity, conduct, practice, or performance of any work then 20 21 being done or about to be commenced. The order shall be issued 2.2 in the name of the State of Alabama under the authority of the board. A person, firm, or corporation that does not comply 23 with a cease and desist order shall be deemed in violation of 24 this chapter and shall be subject to all disciplinary powers, 25 penalties, fines, and remedies available to the board." 26

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its 1 2 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 3 4 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 5 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 6 7 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime. 8

9 Section 3. The provisions of this act are severable.
10 If any part of this act is declared invalid or
11 unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part
12 which remains.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
