18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Section 34-23-2 of the Code of Alabama
20	1975, is amended to read as follows:
21	"§34-23-2.
22	" <u>(a)</u> The practice of pharmacy and the management and
23	operation of pharmacies are hereby declared to affect the
24	public health, safety and welfare of the people of Alabama,
25	and thereby subject to regulation and control in the public
26	interest. Because the practice of pharmacy is characterized by
27	a need of unusual learning and an adherence to a standard of

ethics higher than that of the market place, the practice of pharmacy is declared a learned profession. It is further declared to be a matter of public interest and concern that only qualified persons compound or dispense prescription drugs and medicines, and that pharmacies be managed in such a manner as to protect the public, and all provisions of this chapter shall be liberally construed to carry out these objects and purposes. This subsection shall not be interpreted in any way to restrict the ownership, operation, or method of conducting a pharmacy in this state.

"(b) This section does not expand or enlarge the scope of the practice of the profession of pharmacy and shall not be construed to authorize or permit a pharmacist licensed under this chapter to diagnose, treat, or prescribe for any human illness, injury, disease, or condition, or to dispense or cause to be dispensed a different drug or brand of drug in lieu of that ordered or prescribed except as permitted by Section 34-23-8 or to otherwise engage in the practice of medicine as that term is defined in Section 34-24-50."

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
