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21	To amend Section 17-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975,
22	relating to the meeting days of county boards of registrars,
23	to allow the members of the Talladega County Board of
24	Registrars to meet a maximum of 220 days per year and an
25	additional 30 days at the discretion of the chair of the
26	county commission.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 17-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
 amended to read as follows:

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"§17-3-8.

4 "(a) Each member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Chambers, Clay, Cleburne, Coosa, Dallas, Escambia, 5 6 Geneva, Lowndes, Perry, Sumter, and Wilcox may meet a maximum 7 of 120 working days each fiscal year; each member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Barbour, Blount, Butler, 8 9 Fayette, Greene, Lee, Marengo, Pickens, Pike, Randolph, 10 Talladega, and Winston may meet a maximum of 168 working days each fiscal year, except in the Counties of Lee and Pike each 11 12 board of registrars may meet up to an additional 30 session 13 days each fiscal year, at the discretion of the chair of the 14 county commission, and such days shall be paid from the 15 respective county funds; each member of the board of registrars in Tallapoosa County and each member of the board 16 17 of registrars in Talladega County may meet a maximum of 220 working days each fiscal year, except that in Talladega County 18 the board of registrars may meet up to an additional 30 19 session days each fiscal year, at the discretion of the chair 20 21 of the county commission; each member of the board of 22 registrars in the Counties of Dale, Franklin, Houston, Marion, 23 Marshall, Bullock, Macon, and Tuscaloosa may meet a maximum of 216 working days each fiscal year; and each member of the 24 board of registrars in the Counties of DeKalb, Elmore, 25 Limestone, Russell, and Shelby may meet a maximum of 167 26 27 working days each fiscal year.

"(b) In the Counties of Choctaw, Coffee, Colbert,
 Cullman, Lauderdale, and Monroe, each member of the board of
 registrars may meet a maximum of 199 working days each fiscal
 year.

"(c) Each member of the Board of Registrars of 5 6 Autauga and Bibb Counties may meet a maximum of 187 working 7 days each fiscal year. Each member of the Board of Registrars of Walker County may meet a maximum of 200 days each fiscal 8 year and each member of the Board of Registrars of Lamar, 9 10 Cherokee, Clarke, Conecuh, Crenshaw, Hale, and Washington Counties may meet a maximum of 140 days each fiscal year. Each 11 12 member of the board of registrars in the following counties 13 may meet the following maximum number of working days each 14 fiscal year: Henry - 140 working days; Covington - 188 working days; Jackson - 207 working days; Etowah - 207 working days; 15 and Lawrence - 140 working days. 16

17 "(d) Each member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Baldwin, Calhoun, Chilton, Madison, Mobile, 18 Montgomery, St. Clair, and Morgan are authorized to meet not 19 20 more than five days each week for the purpose of carrying out 21 their official duties. Jefferson County, which is now 22 operating under the provisions of local laws, shall be 23 exempted from the provisions of this section. Provided, 24 however, that where the words "each year" are used in the 25 local laws the words mean "each fiscal year."

"(e) The actual number of working days to be used as
 session days shall be determined by a quorum of the board of
 registrars according to the needs of the county.

4 "(f) As many as 25 of the allotted working days may be used for special registration sessions (i.e., those 5 sessions held away from the courthouse in the several 6 7 precincts of the county or sessions held on Saturday or between the hours of 5:00 P.M. and 9:00 P.M.). Notice of any 8 special session scheduled by the board shall be given at least 9 10 10 days prior to the special session by (1) bills posted at three or more public places in each election precinct 11 12 affected, if the session involves precinct visits, and (2) advertisement once a week for two successive weeks in a 13 14 newspaper published in the county or by radio or television 15 announcements on a local station, or both by newspaper or announcement." 16

Section 2. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
