BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- (a) At the next election following redistricting of the city council districts as provided in subsection (b), the Birmingham City Council shall be comprised of eight members elected to terms of four years from single-member districts and a president elected to a term of four years from the city-at-large. Each city council member shall be a resident of the district from which he or she is elected and the president of the council shall be a resident of the City of Birmingham. The president shall preside over meetings of the council, but shall not vote except in the case of a tie vote.
- (b) Immediately after the population figures from the federal decennial census compiled for 2010 are released by the federal government, the Birmingham City Council shall adopt a plan dividing the county into eight districts approximately of equal population as provided by law. The districts shall be operable for the next general election following the release of the 2010 census population figures.

1 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 2 shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 3 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 5 6 state. 7 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 8 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 9 10 following description of the substance or subject matter of 11 the proposed constitutional amendment: 12 "Relating to the City of Birmingham, proposing an 13 amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide for the districts for the election of eight members of the 14 Birmingham City Council and to provide for the president of 15 the council to be elected at-large. 16 "Proposed by Act _____." 17 18 This description shall be followed by the following 19 language:
