(a) No teacher, support employee, or employee as defined in Section 16-25-1, Code of Alabama 1975, shall be allowed membership in the Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama while being employed at a location outside the boundaries of the State of Alabama that is used to provide instruction to students for an institution that is a member of the Teachers' Retirement System.

8 (b) No retirement contributions shall be allowed for 9 salary or service credit on salary earned on services 10 administrated outside the State of Alabama for correspondence 11 courses and on-line courses to students residing outside the 12 State of Alabama by in-state instructors.

13 (c) The provisions of this act shall be applicable
14 to new employees employed at Distance Learning Centers located
15 outside the State of Alabama after October 1, 2010.

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
