There is levied, in addition to all other 1 taxes of every kind now imposed by law, and shall be collected 2 and enforced pursuant to rules adopted by the Department of 3 Revenue a fee of five dollars (\$5) for each prescription drug or item of personal property purchased pursuant to a 5 prescription from a nonresident retailer and delivered to a 6 7 person in this state. Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 8 first day of the third month following its passage and 9 10 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
