Section 1. Section 9-11-84 of the Code of Alabama
 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§9-11-84.

4 "(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale within this state, or ship or transport for 5 6 sale within or without this state, or to ship into this state 7 any game fish caught or taken in any of the fresh waters, whether public or private, of this state or any other state. 8 All species of black bass, white bass, yellow bass, saltwater 9 10 striped bass, bream, and pickerel, as well as walleye, sauger, black and white crappie, and yellow perch are designated game 11 12 fish for the purpose of this section.

13 "(b) This section shall not apply to the sale of 14 game fish raised in hatcheries and sold for the purposes of stocking ponds and lakes, nor shall it apply to the sale of 15 nonnative game fish raised for human consumption, nor shall it 16 17 apply to the sale of <u>vellow perch</u>, largemouth bass, shellcracker, and bluegill bream raised in farm ponds; 18 provided, that, prior to any sale provided for in this 19 section, the seller shall have first obtained a permit for the 20 21 sale from the Commissioner, Department of Conservation and 22 Natural Resources.

"(c) Nothing in this section shall prevent the
practice of private pond owners or managers charging for game
fish caught by fishermen from the pond when the charges are
based on the number of fish caught or the total pounds caught.

1 "(d) A violation of this section shall constitute a
2 misdemeanor; and, upon conviction thereof, the person, firm,
3 or corporation convicted shall be fined not less than five
4 hundred dollars (\$500) nor more than one thousand dollars
5 (\$1,000) for each offense."

6 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 7 first day of the third month following its passage and 8 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
