19	AN ACT
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21	Relating to the practice of nursing by certified
22	registered nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives;
23	to amend Sections 34-21-81 and 34-21-86, Code of Alabama 1975,
24	to authorize the certified registered nurse practitioners and
25	certified nurse midwives to prescribe certain controlled
26	substances under certain conditions.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 34-21-81 and 34-21-86, Code of
 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

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"§34-21-81.

4 "As used in this article, the following terms shall5 have the following meanings:

"(3)(1) ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSE. A registered nurse 6 7 that has gained additional knowledge and skills through successful completion of an organized program of nursing 8 education that prepares nurses for advanced practice roles and 9 10 has been certified by the Board of Nursing to engage in the practice of advanced practice nursing. There shall be four 11 12 categories of advanced practice nurses: Certified registered 13 nurse practitioners (CRNP), certified nurse midwives (CNM), 14 certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNA), and clinical 15 nurse specialists (CNS). Certified registered nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives are subject to 16 17 collaborative practice agreements with an Alabama physician. Certified registered nurse anesthetists and clinical nurse 18 specialists are not subject to collaborative practice 19 20 agreements with an Alabama physician and are not subject to 21 the requirements of Sections 34-21-82, 34-21-83, and 34-21-85 to 34-21-92, inclusive, and are prohibited from engaging in 22 23 any of the acts or functions of a certified registered nurse 24 practitioner (CRNP) or a certified nurse midwife (CNM) as 25 established by this article and regulations rules adopted under this article. 26

1 "(4)(2) ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSING. The delivery of 2 health care services by registered nurses who have gained 3 additional knowledge and skills through successful completion 4 of an organized program of nursing education that prepares 5 nurses for advanced practice roles as certified registered 6 nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, certified nurse 7 anesthetists, and clinical nurse specialists:

8 "a. Practice as a certified registered nurse 9 practitioner (CRNP) means the performance of nursing skills by 10 a registered nurse who has demonstrated by certification that 11 he or she has advanced knowledge and skills in the delivery of 12 nursing services within a health care system that provides for 13 consultation, collaborative management, or referral as 14 indicated by the health status of the <u>client patient</u>.

15 "b. Practice as a certified nurse midwife (CNM) means the performance of nursing skills by a registered nurse 16 17 who has demonstrated by certification that he or she has advanced knowledge and skills relative to the management of 18 women's health care focusing on pregnancy, childbirth, the 19 postpartum period, care of the newborn, family planning, and 20 21 gynecological needs of women, within a health care system that 22 provides for consultation, collaborative management, or 23 referral as indicated by the health status of the client 24 patient.

"c. Practice as a certified registered nurse
anesthetist (CRNA) means the performance of or the assistance
in any act involving the determination, preparation,

administration, or monitoring of any drug used to render an individual insensible to pain for surgical and other therapeutic or diagnostic procedures. The nurse anesthetist is qualified in accordance with Section 27-46-3 and is licensed by the Board of Nursing and functions under the direction of a physician licensed to practice medicine, or a dentist, who is immediately available.

8 "d. Practice of clinical nurse specialist (CNS) 9 nursing means the performance of nursing skills by a 10 registered nurse who, through study and supervised practice at 11 the graduate level and as evidenced by certification, has 12 advanced knowledge and practice skills in a specialized area 13 of practice, except that a clinical nurse specialist may not 14 do any of the following:

15 "1. Perform delegated medical acts or engage in16 collaborative practice as described in this article.

17 "2. Perform any of the functions of a certified 18 registered nurse practitioner or a certified nurse midwife as 19 described in this article and the regulations rules adopted 20 under this article, whether or not performed within a 21 collaborative practice relationship.

"3. Prescribe drugs of any type. A clinical nurse
specialist may perform nursing services permitted under this
subdivision as an independent contractor.

25 "(1)(3) BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS. The State Board
 26 of Medical Examiners established pursuant to Section 34-24-53.

"(2)(4) BOARD OF NURSING. The Board of Nursing
 established under Section 34-21-2.

"(5) COLLABORATION. A formal relationship between 3 4 one or more certified registered nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives and a physician or physicians under 5 which these nurses may engage in advanced practice nursing as 6 7 evidenced by written protocols approved in accordance with the requirements of this article or exempted in accordance with 8 requirements of this article. The term collaboration does not 9 10 require direct, on-site supervision of the activities of a certified registered nurse practitioner or a certified nurse 11 12 midwife by the collaborating physician. The term does require 13 such professional oversight and direction as may be required 14 by the rules and regulations of the State Board of Medical 15 Examiners and the Board of Nursing.

16 "(7)(6) JOINT COMMITTEE OF THE STATE BOARD OF 17 MEDICAL EXAMINERS AND THE BOARD OF NURSING FOR ADVANCED 18 PRACTICE NURSES. The Joint Committee of the State Board of 19 Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing for Advanced 20 Practice Nurses shall mean and shall be a committee composed 21 of all of the following:

22 "a. Two physicians licensed to practice medicine in23 the State of Alabama.

24 "b. One registered nurse licensed to practice25 professional nursing in the State of Alabama.

26 "c. One licensed physician engaged in a27 collaborative practice with a certified registered nurse

practitioner or a certified nurse midwife in the State of
 Alabama.

3 "d. One certified registered nurse practitioner
4 engaged in advanced practice with a physician in the State of
5 Alabama.

"(8)(7) LEGEND DRUG. Any drug, medicine, chemical, 6 7 or poison bearing on the label the words, "Caution, Federal Law prohibits dispensing without prescription" or similar 8 words indicating that such drug, medicine, chemical, or poison 9 10 may be sold or dispensed only upon the prescription of a licensed practitioner, except that the term legend drug shall 11 12 not include any drug, substance, or compound which is listed 13 in Schedules I through V or II of the Alabama Uniform 14 Controlled Substances Act.

15 "(6)(8) PHYSICIAN or COLLABORATING PHYSICIAN. A
16 doctor of medicine or a doctor of osteopathy licensed to
17 practice medicine in Alabama who agrees in writing to practice
18 in collaboration with one or more certified registered nurse
19 practitioners or certified nurse midwives in accordance with
20 the rules and regulations adopted by the State Board of
21 Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing.

"(9) PRESCRIBE or PRESCRIBING. The act of issuing a
 written prescription for a legend drug, including controlled
 substances in Schedules III to V, inclusive, of the Alabama
 Uniform Controlled Substances Act.

26 "(10) PRESCRIPTION. An order for a legend drug which
 27 is written and signed given by a practitioner authorized by

1 law to prescribe and administer such drugs and which is 2 intended to be filled, compounded, or dispensed by a 3 pharmacist.

4 "(11) PROTOCOL. A document approved in accordance
5 with Section 34-21-87 establishing the permissible functions
6 and activities to be performed by certified registered nurse
7 practitioners and certified nurse midwives and signed by
8 collaborating physicians and any nurse practitioners or nurse
9 midwives practicing with those physicians.

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"§34-21-86.

11 "(a) Certified registered nurse practitioners and 12 certified nurse midwives, engaged in collaborative practice 13 with physicians practicing under protocols approved in the 14 manner prescribed by this article may prescribe legend drugs, 15 <u>including controlled substances in Schedules III to V,</u> 16 <u>inclusive, of the Alabama Uniform Controlled Substances Act</u> to 17 their patients, subject to both of the following conditions:

18 "(1) The drug type, dosage, quantity prescribed, and 19 number of refills shall be authorized in an approved protocol 20 signed by the collaborating physician; and

"(2) The drug shall be on the formulary recommended
by the joint committee and adopted by the State Board of
Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing.

"(b) A certified registered nurse practitioner or a
certified nurse midwife may not initiate a call-in
prescription in the name of a collaborating physician for any
drug, whether legend or controlled substance, which the nurse

practitioner or certified nurse midwife is not authorized to 1 2 prescribe under the protocol signed by the collaborating physician and certified registered nurse practitioner or 3 4 certified nurse midwife and approved under this section unless the drug is specifically ordered for the patient by the 5 physician, either in writing or by a verbal order which has 6 7 been reduced to writing, and which has been signed by the physician within a time specified in the rules and regulations 8 approved by the State Board of Medical Examiners and the Board 9 10 of Nursing.

"(c) Registered nurses and licensed practical nurses are authorized to administer any legend drug, including <u>controlled substances in Schedules III to V, inclusive, of the</u> <u>Alabama Uniform Controlled Substances Act</u> that has been lawfully ordered or prescribed by an authorized practitioner including certified registered nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, and/or assistants to physicians.

"(d) The Board of Medical Examiners shall be the 18 certifying board for issuance of controlled substances 19 registration certificates and shall promulgate rules and set 20 21 reasonable fees for registration and for the administration of 22 this article relating to the prescription or dispensing of controlled substances by certified registered nurse 23 practitioners or certified nurse midwives in accordance with 24 this <u>article.</u>" 25

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
