ENROLLED, An Act,

To propose an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to prohibit the imposition of a municipal business license tax in Calhoun County on the rental of residential real estate based on a per unit basis.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

In Calhoun County, no municipal business license tax shall be levied on the rental of residential real estate based on a per unit tax rate.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 284.01 of the Official ReCompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the

1 following description of the substance or subject matter of
2 the proposed constitutional amendment:

3 "Relating to Calhoun County, proposing an amendment
4 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to prohibit the
5 imposition of a municipal business license tax in Calhoun
6 County on the rental of residential real estate based on a per
7 unit basis.
