23	take necessary steps to ensure that this act complies with the
24	Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.
25	"(b) The election will be called to coincide with
26	the next mayoral election after final approval of this act by
27	the United States Department of Justice.

"(c) The initial election and the initial runoff election, if necessary, and all subsequent elections held pursuant to this act shall be conducted, the vote canvassed, and the results declared in the same manner as provided for the election of members of the city council, unless otherwise required in this act.

"(d) The initial elected members of the board of 7 education shall assume office immediately upon the 8 certification of the election results and shall serve initial 9 10 terms of office which shall expire at the same prescribed time as the expiration of the corresponding terms of office of the 11 12 then current city council members. Thereafter, all members of 13 the board shall be elected at the same time, in the same 14 manner, assume office at the same time on the fourth Tuesday in October, and serve the same term of office as the members 15 of the Birmingham City Council." 16

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
