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8	To propose an amendment to the Constitution of
9	Alabama of 1901, relating to Baldwin County; to provide that
10	only county-owned solid waste landfills may be used for the
11	disposal of garbage, household waste, industrial solid waste,
12	and solid waste; to exempt the disposal of certain inert
13	debris and construction materials from the proposed amendment;
14	to provide for certain exempted contracts; to exempt on-site
15	or privately owned industrial landfills; to provide that the
16	county may not charge rates exceeding rates for similar
17	services charged by public and private landfill operators in
18	surrounding counties; to provide for violations to the
19	amendment; to require the county governing body to create the
20	Baldwin County Solid Waste Management Authority to make
21	recommendations to the county governing body relating to the
22	operation of county landfills; and to allow the implementation
23	and administration by local acts of the Legislature.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The following amendment to the
26	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become

valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

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(a) Except as provided in subsection (c) to exempt 4 certain contracts and to exempt the disposal of certain inert 5 debris and construction materials, in Baldwin County, only 6 7 county-owned solid waste landfills may be used for the disposal of garbage, household waste, industrial solid waste, 8 and solid waste as defined in Section 22-27-1 et seq., Code of 9 10 Alabama 1975. The rates for disposal at county-owned or 11 operated solid waste landfills shall not exceed the 12 established gate rates for similar services charged by 13 publicly or privately owned solid waste landfills that process 14 similar average daily volumes as the county-owned or operated 15 landfills in the following counties: Mobile, Escambia, 16 Washington, Monroe, Clarke, Conecuh, and Escambia County, 17 Florida.

18 (b) The county governing body shall create the Baldwin County Solid Waste Management Authority comprised of 19 five members at least two of whom shall be mayors of 20 municipalities in Baldwin County. The committee shall 21 22 recommend methods of operation, communications, rates, 23 municipal recycling programs, revenue sharing, and other solid 24 waste landfill functions as requested by the county governing 25 body.

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(c) (1) Contracts in effect on December 1, 2009,
 between municipalities and other entities for solid waste
 collection and disposal, including, but not limited to,
 dumpster contacts contracts and recycling programs, are exempt
 from this amendment.

(2) The disposal of debris including, but not 6 7 limited to, leaves, limbs, brush, and yard debris and construction materials collected for disposal by a 8 9 municipality at a municipal facility pursuant to a clean-up following a storm, flood, hurricane, or other weather related 10 11 disaster is exempt from the requirements of this amendment 12 municipality at a municipal or private facility is exempt from the requirements of this amendment. 13

14 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act,
 15 on-site or privately owned industrial landfills that receive
 16 only waste generated on-site or by the industrial permit
 17 holder are expressly exempt from this act.

(d) Any person, firm, or corporation found in 18 violation of this amendment shall be quilty of a misdemeanor 19 and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty 20 dollars (\$50) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200), and if 21 2.2 the violation or failure or refusal to obey or comply with 23 this amendment is a continuing one, each day's violation shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punished 24 accordingly. All citations to violators of this article shall 25 26 be served by any lawful officer or by the Solid Waste Officer.

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Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

7 (e) The Legislature, by local law, may provide for
8 the implementation and administration of the provisions of
9 this amendment.

10 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 11 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 12 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 13 following description of the substance or subject matter of 14 the proposed constitutional amendment:

15 "Relating to Baldwin County, proposing an amendment 16 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that only 17 county-owned solid waste landfills may be used for the disposal of garbage, household waste, industrial solid waste 18 19 and solid waste; to exempt the disposal of <u>inert</u> certain 20 debris and construction materials from the proposed amendment; 21 to provide that the county may not charge established gate 22 rates exceeding the rates for similar services charged by 23 public and private solid waste landfill operators in surrounding counties; to provide for violations to the 24 25 amendment; to provide that the Baldwin County governing body 26 shall create the Baldwin County Solid Waste Management

Authority to recommend methods of operation, rates, and other 1 2 functions requested by the Baldwin County governing body; and to authorize local laws for the implementation and 3 4 administration of the provisions of the amendment. "Proposed by Act \_\_\_\_\_." 5 This description shall be followed by the following 6 7 language: "Yes ( ) No ( )." 8
