BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT

No person elected or appointed circuit clerk in any county in Alabama may assume a supernumerary office after the ratification date of this amendment. Any person who, on the ratification date of this amendment, is entitled to participate in a supernumerary program for circuit clerks or registers may continue to participate in that supernumerary program, which shall include the assumption of a supernumerary office according to the terms and conditions of the law which established that supernumerary program. Every circuit clerk of every county of this state may participate in the Employees' Retirement System (ERS) upon the same terms and conditions as may be specified by law for other employees in the ERS. Circuit clerks holding office at the time of the ratification of this amendment shall be eliqible to purchase service credit in the ERS for the time the circuit clerk has served in the current office; provided, however, the official shall forego the assumption of a supernumerary office. All costs associated with the purchase of prior service credit shall be the responsibility of the retiring circuit clerk making the purchase.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that on and after the ratification of this amendment, circuit clerks of each county in Alabama may participate in the Employees' Retirement System (ERS) and may not begin participation in the state circuit clerk supernumerary system; to authorize circuit clerks participating in the ERS to purchase prior service time in the ERS; to allow circuit clerks and registers holding office as a supernumerary office on the ratification date of this amendment to continue to hold supernumerary status.

"Proposed by Act ."

This description shall be followed by the following language:
