PROPOSED AMENDMENT

2 Because all people should have the right to make decisions about their health care, no law shall be passed that 3 4 restricts a person's freedom of choice of private health care systems or private plans of any type. No law shall interfere 5 6 with a person's or entity's right to pay directly for lawful 7 medical services, nor shall any law impose a penalty or fine, of any type, for choosing to obtain or decline health care 8 coverage or for participation in any particular health care 9 10 system or plan.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to prohibit any person, employer, or health care provider from being compelled to participate in any health care system.
