To amend Section 32-6-1.1 of the Code of Alabama

1975, to provide that a member of the military who is deployed

outside of the United States in a combat zone shall have his

or her driver's license automatically renewed by the

Department of Public Safety for a one year-period if the

member forwards a copy of his or her military orders to the

department.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 32-6-1.1 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$32-6-1.1.

"(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the driver's license of any resident of this state who is a member of the National Guard or the Armed Forces of the United States whose driver's license has expired and who is on active duty and deployed outside the United States shall be valid as long as the military member has on his or her person a copy of valid military orders with any amendments. In addition, if the member of the military is deployed outside of the United States in a combat zone, the driver's license of the military member shall be automatically renewed by the Department of Public Safety for a one-year period from the date of expiration without additional costs if the member forwards electronically or otherwise a copy of his or her valid military orders with amendments to the department.

"(b) The Department of Public Safety may develop procedures authorizing members of the National Guard and armed

forces receiving orders to be deployed outside the United

States to renew their driver's licenses up to one year prior

to the expiration of the license."

Section 2. This act shall become effective

immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
