21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited
23	as the Home-Generated Medical Sharps Disposal Act.
24	Section 2. The Legislature finds that:
25	(1) Each year, according to the Environmental
26	Protection Agency, more than three billion medical sharps are
27	used by individuals in their homes.

- 1 (2) Typically, these medical sharps are put into the 2 household trash, where they become a health hazard for other 3 members of the household and for sanitation workers.
 - (3) The hazard includes not only the discomfort of a needle-stick injury, but also the risk of contracting an infectious disease from a contaminated medical sharp.
 - (4) Regulating the disposal of home-generated medical sharps will further the public health and safety of Alabama residents.
- Section 3. As used in this act, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
- 12 (1) DEPARTMENT. The State Department of Public 13 Health.

- (2) HOME-GENERATED MEDICAL SHARP. A medical sharp used by an individual in a setting other than a medical office, hospital, or similar setting.
 - (3) MEDICAL SHARP. A needle, syringe, lancet, or other sharp object used to penetrate the skin for medical testing or for delivery of medication.
 - Section 4. (a) The department shall develop and implement a statewide educational program designed to inform the public about safe disposal of home-generated medical sharps and to promote the public's safe disposal of home-generated medical sharps.
- (b) The department shall develop the program no later than July 1, 2011, and shall implement the program no later than January 1, 2012.

Section 5. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
