20 To amend Section 17-6-8, Code of Alabama 1975,  
21 relating to the information required to be submitted to the  
22 Permanent Legislative Committee on Reapportionment, to  
23 clarify the type of information provided to the committee and  
24 allow the information to be provided electronically.

25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

26 Section 1. Section 17-6-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is  
27 amended to read as follows:

1                   "§17-6-8.

2                   "All state and county agencies and officials shall  
3 cooperate with the Permanent Legislative Committee on  
4 Reapportionment in carrying out the purposes of this chapter  
5 ~~and shall cooperate with~~ by providing the Permanent  
6 Legislative Committee on Reapportionment ~~in the development of~~  
7 with any information, electronic or otherwise, regarding any  
8 adjustments or revisions of precinct boundaries in their  
9 respective counties within 30 days of the change in  
10 boundaries. All state and county agencies and officials shall  
11 also cooperate in the development of all information, maps,  
12 and other data as is needed to comply with requirements of the  
13 Census Bureau. Failure to comply with the provisions of this  
14 chapter shall be a Class B misdemeanor punishable as  
15 prescribed by law."

16                   Section 2. This act shall become effective on the  
17 first day of the third month following its passage and  
18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
