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4 <u>ENROLLED</u>, An Act,

To propose an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide for a ten year road, bridge and other transportation related construction and improvement program to be funded with appropriations from the Alabama Trust Fund and to provide for a transfer of funds to the County and Municipal Government Capital Improvement Fund.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Beginning in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011 and continuing through the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, the Legislature shall appropriate from the Alabama Trust Fund the amount of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) in each fiscal year, subject to the limitation in Section 4. The appropriation may be made in either the general appropriations act or a separate appropriations act,

and the funds shall be distributed as provided in subdivisions

and 2 below, except as may be provided in Section 3 of this

amendment.

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- (1) Seventy-five percent (75%) of the appropriation from the Alabama Trust Fund shall be distributed to the Department of Transportation for construction, maintenance and repair of state and local highways, roads, and bridges and other transportation purposes as follows:
- a. One million dollars (\$1,000,000) of this amount shall be distributed to the Alabama Shortline Railroad Infrastructure Rehabilitation Fund established by Act No. 2008-382 in the 2008 Regular Session. These funds shall be granted in a manner which will enhance economic development and growth by providing for the proper rehabilitation and upgrading of shortline railroads. In order to be eligible to receive grant funds from this allocation an eligible grantee must provide matching funds equal to 20% of the amount of the grant award which shall be allocated for the same purposes for which the grant is made.
- b. A total of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) shall be expended in each congressional district in the state as these districts exist on the effective date of this amendment.
- 24 (i) For each of the fiscal years ending September 25 30, 2011 and 2012, the funds allocated to the fifth

congressional district shall be expended in the Primary Study
Area, including Redstone Arsenal, as such area was identified
in the Tennessee Valley Regional Growth Coordination Plan of
March 2009.

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- (ii) Beginning with the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011 and continuing through the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, one million dollars (\$1,000,000) of the funds allocated annually to the sixth congressional district and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) of the funds allocated annually to the seventh congressional district shall be expended to fund mass transit.
- (iii) For each of the fiscal years ending September 30, 2011 and 2012, one million dollars (\$1,000,000) of the funds allocated to the sixth congressional district shall be expended to leverage federal funds to complete a new study for interchange improvements at Interstate 459 and Highway 280.
- (iv) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011, the five million dollars (\$5,000,000) allocated to the first congressional district shall be distributed to the Alabama State Port Authority for capital improvements to the state port in order to continue to expand the economic opportunities for Alabama industries.
- (v) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011, one million dollars (\$1,000,000) of the funds allocated to the second congressional district shall be distributed to the

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- (vi) For each of the fiscal years ending September 30, 2011 and 2012, one million dollars (\$1,000,000) of the funds allocated to the third congressional district shall be distributed to the Russell County Commission for infrastructure supporting the growth and expansion related to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission (BRAC).
 - c. The remainder shall be expended as follows:
- 1. An amount equal to forty-five percent (45%) divided by 67 shall be expended in each county, subject to subdivision (1) c. 3.
- 2. An amount equal to fifty-five percent (55%) divided on the basis of the ratio of the population of each county to the total population of the state according to then next preceding federal decennial census shall be expended in each county, subject to subdivision (1) c. 3.
- 3. The Department of Transportation shall ensure that the expenditure requirements in subdivision (1) c. 1. and (1) c. 2. for each county are met during the 10-year life of the appropriations authorized in this amendment. The Department is not required to expend the funds as provided in subdivision (1) c. 1. and (1) c. 2. on an annual basis but shall make an annual report of its expenditures to the Joint Transportation Committee or its successor.

1	4. In order to provide a uniform procedure for
2	bidding projects, the Department of Transportation shall
3	administer the bid process in accordance with procedures
4	established for this purpose. The Department shall not charge
5	an administrative fee for the bid process for funds allocated
6	pursuant to this subdivision (1) c.

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- (2) The remaining twenty-five (25%) shall be distributed to the counties and municipalities to be used for new construction and maintenance and repair. This amount shall be allocated as follows:
- a. Forty-five percent (45%) shall be allocated equally among the sixty-seven counties of the state.
- b. Fifty-five percent (55%) shall be allocated among the sixty-seven counties of the state on the basis of the ratio of the population of each county to the total population of the state according to the then next preceding federal decennial census.
- c. Ten percent of the total amount allocated to each county in accordance with subdivisions (2)a. and b. of this amendment shall be distributed among the municipalities within the county on the basis of the ratio of the population of each municipality to the total population of all municipalities in the county according to the then next preceding federal decennial census.

1	Section 2. In the awarding of contracts utilizing
2	funds appropriated in this amendment, the Department of
3	Transportation and the local governments may give preference
4	to Alabama based companies which employ Alabama residents to
5	the extent authorized by Alabama laws.

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Section 3. Funds expended under Section 1 shall comply with the United States Department of Transportation's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program in compliance with the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 49, Subpart C, Section 26.41(a). There is hereby created a fund in the State Treasury to be known as the Disadvantaged Enterprise Collateral Fund. The Legislature shall provide for appropriations to this fund from amounts allocated under this amendment. The Alabama Department of Transportation shall appoint a committee to insure participation of the disadvantaged business enterprises ("DBEs") in funds expended under Section 1. and to review the funds expended under the Disadvantaged Enterprise Collateral Fund. This committee shall carry out its duties as determined by the committee membership. The committee shall be comprised of: the Chairman of the House General Fund Appropriations Committee; the Chairman of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee; the DBE Administrator from the Construction Bureau of the Alabama Department of Transportation; and four members recommended to the Director of the Alabama Department of

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Transportation, two of whom are designated by the Alabama DBE Contractors Association, Inc. to represent DBEs, and two of whom are designated by the Alabama Road Builders Association, Inc. to represent the construction industry. The membership of this committee shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban-rural, and economic diversity of the state. The committee shall annually report to the legislature by the second day of each regular session the extent to which the committee has complied with the provisions provided for in the act. The Legislature shall provide for appropriations to this fund from amounts allocated under this amendment.

Section 4. No part of any appropriation may be allotted if such allotment would cause the total capital of the Alabama Trust Fund as of the end of the previous fiscal year to fall below two billion dollars (\$2,000,000,000). For the purposes of this amendment total capital shall not include any amount that has been withdrawn from either the Education Trust Fund Rainy Day Account or the State General Fund Rainy Day Account and that has not been repaid to either account as of the end of the applicable fiscal year. In the event that an amount less than one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is allotted in any fiscal year pursuant to this amendment, the amount not allotted due to this limitation may be appropriated in a subsequent fiscal year.

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1	Section 5. In order to compensate for the reduction
2	in interest earnings to local governments due to the transfer
3	of funds from the Alabama Trust Fund, the following additional
4	transfers shall be made from the Alabama Trust Fund in each of
5	the following fiscal years to be divided equally between the
6	Municipal Government Capital Improvement Fund created in Code
7	of Alabama 1975, Section 11-66-4 and the County Government
8	Capital Improvement Fund created in Code of Alabama 1975,
9	Section 11-29-4.

5	Section 6. An election upon the proposed amendment
6	shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the
7	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284
8	and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
9	Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this
10	state.
11	Section 7. The appropriate election official shall
12	assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
13	amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
14	following description of the substance or subject matter of
15	the proposed constitutional amendment:
16	"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of
17	Alabama of 1901, as amended, relating to the Alabama Trust
18	Fund, to provide for the appropriation of funds in the Alabama
