22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. (a) A person who has been charged with a
24	felony or misdemeanor criminal offense, a violation, or a
25	traffic violation and who has been fully exonerated of the
26	offense as charged shall have his or her record as to the
27	crime automatically expunded.

- (b) Nothing in this act shall prohibit a law
 enforcement agency or official, a prosecuting authority, or
 the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences from maintaining
 an investigative file, which may include evidence, biological
 evidence, photographs, exhibits, or information in documentary
 or electronic form.
 - (c) For the purposes of this act, the term "record" shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:
 - (1) Arrest records.

- (2) Booking or arrest photographs of the person.
- (3) Index references such as with the ACJIC, or any other governmental index references for public records search.
- (4) Other data, whether in documentary or electronic form, relating to the arrest, charge, or other matters arising out of the arrest or charge or relating to the conviction or other matters arising out of the conviction.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
