SYNOPSIS: The Prepaid Affordable College Tuition 8 program which was enacted in 1989 has provided an 9 10 opportunity for the purchase of PACT contracts to 11 provide for future college tuition payments to be 12 made. The program has provided these payments for 13 each year since inception. The PACT Board has suspended new entrants into the program and has 14 15 expressed concerns about the ability to meet the 16 contractual obligations for those participants 17 still in the program. Since the PACT program was 18 enacted by the Legislature and the PACT Board is an 19 agency of the state, the payment of contractual 20 obligations of this state agency is an issue that 21 should be addressed by this Legislature. This bill 22 will provide for the funding to offset any 23 shortfall if the assets of the program are 24 insufficient to meet the obligations. 25

9	upon the dissolution of the PACT Program.
10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
11	Section 1. Definitions:
12	APSCA The Alabama Public School and College
13	Authority, a corporation authorized by Section 16-16-3 Code of
14	Alabama 1975 as amended to issue bonds for educational
15	purposes in Alabama.
16	Base Year Debt Service The debt service for the
17	fiscal year ending September 30, 2013 for bonds issued by the
18	APSCA which are paid from certain tax receipts which accrue to
19	the Education Trust Fund. This amount for Fiscal Year 2013
20	according to the current debt service schedule is
21	\$189,515,980.00.
22	Current Debt Service Schedule The schedules for
23	debt service for bonds issued by the APSCA as such schedules
24	existed on January 1, 2010. It does not include any additional
25	payments which might be due to any refinanced bonds or
26	additional bonds issued after January 1, 2010 which are to be
27	repaid from a tax source which accrues to the Education Trust

Fund. It also does not include the debt service for any bonds
 described under Section 16-16-14 Code of Alabama 1975 as
 amended and commonly referred to as "pool bonds."

4 PACT Program -- The Prepaid Affordable College Tuition program established under Section 16-33c-6 Code of 5 6 Alabama 1975 as amended whereby purchasers enter into 7 contracts for the future payment of tuition and mandatory fees at eligible educational institutions. The PACT program 8 includes the PACT Trust Fund which is the source of payments 9 10 of the obligations of the PACT program under the PACT 11 contracts.

12 Section 2. The Legislature hereby declares that the 13 PACT program which is administered by an agency created by the 14 Legislature has been a successful program providing a valuable 15 service for those individuals trying to prepare for future higher educational expenses. However, the PACT Trust Fund may 16 17 have insufficient assets to meet all future obligations. Since the obligations of the PACT program were authorized by 18 statute, those obligations should be honored by the State of 19 20 Alabama.

21 Section 3. Beginning in the fiscal year ending 22 September 30, 2014 there is hereby annually appropriated from 23 the Education Trust Fund to the PACT Trust Fund an amount 24 equal to the difference between APSCA base year debt service 25 and the APSCA debt service for the then current fiscal year. 26 If the difference between the base year debt service and the 27 then current fiscal year debt service is less than zero then

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no appropriation shall be made. These funds shall be invested 1 2 by the PACT Board and used to meet tuition and fee obligations of the PACT Trust Fund. The appropriations shall continue from 3 4 year to year until the PACT fund has sufficient assets to meet all of the obligations for existing PACT contracts only. The 5 6 PACT board shall not reopen the program for new participants 7 and no funds appropriated herein may be used for contracts not in existence on the effective date of this act. 8

Section 4. The PACT Board shall continue to provide 9 10 for an annual audit of the assets and obligations of the PACT fund. In any year in which the actuarial audit of the PACT 11 12 fund demonstrates that the assets are sufficient to fund the 13 remaining benefits obligations, the PACT Board shall issue a 14 certification to the Legislature stating that sufficient assets are in the fund and that additional appropriations are 15 no longer required. Upon the receipt of the certification the 16 17 appropriation requirement in Section 2 above shall terminate for any subsequent fiscal year. Any funds in the PACT Trust 18 Fund remaining after the payment of all of the obligations of 19 the fund shall be transferred to the Education Trust Fund in 20 the fiscal year immediately following the year in which the 21 22 last obligations are met.

Section 5. Section 16-33c-9 Code of Alabama 1975 is
 hereby repealed.

25 Section 6. The provisions of this act are severable.
26 If any part of this act is declared invalid or

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1 unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part 2 which remains.

3 Section 7. This act shall become effective
4 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor or
5 upon its otherwise becoming a law.
