21	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
22	(a) In order to preserve the freedom of all
23	residents of Alabama to provide for their own health care, a
24	law or rule shall not compel, directly or indirectly, any
25	person, employer, or health care provider to participate in
26	any health care system.

(b) A person or employer may pay directly for health
care services and shall not be required to pay penalties or
fines for paying directly for lawful health care services. A
health care provider may accept direct payment for lawful
health care services and shall not be required to pay
penalties or fines for accepting direct payment from a person
or employer for lawful health care services.

8 (c) The purchase or sale of health insurance in 9 private health care systems shall not be prohibited by law or 10 rule.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held on July 31, 2010, and shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to prohibit any person, employer, or health care provider from being compelled to participate in any health care system.
