19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Section 32-6-250, Code of Alabama 1975,
21	is amended to read as follows:
22	"\$32-6-250.
23	(a) A distinctive permanent license plate shall be
24	issued to any resident of the state who is a recipient of the
25	Medal of Honor or the widow <u>surviving spouse</u> of a recipient of
26	the Medal of Honor, to any resident who is a recipient of the
27	Purple Heart Medal <u>or his or her surviving spouse</u> , or to any

1 resident who shows by satisfactory proof that he or she was a 2 duly recognized former prisoner of war or his or her surviving spouse, for use on a private motor vehicle registered in the 3 4 name of the resident. There shall be no fee or tax, including 5 ad valorem tax, for the license plate, except Purple Heart Medal recipients shall pay ad valorem taxes on vehicles for 6 7 which the distinctive plates are issued, and no recipient shall receive a plate for more than one vehicle except as 8 provided in subsection (c) motor vehicle. 9

10 "(b) A former prisoner of war for purposes of this 11 section is a person who, as a member of the United States 12 Armed Forces, or while serving with a formal United States 13 ally force, or as a United States civilian, was held as a 14 prisoner of war during any armed conflict by forces hostile to 15 the United States.

16 "(c) A person eligible to be issued a distinctive 17 license plate under this section may be issued additional distinctive license plates, under any of the above license 18 19 plate categories, if the person otherwise qualifies to receive 20 the distinctive license plate, upon payment of all license tax 21 and registration fees, including ad valorem taxes, for the 22 vehicles. Annual renewal decals shall be provided after 23 payment, if required, of license fees and taxes for the years 24 during which a new tag or plate is not issued as provided in Section 32-6-63. Upon request, Purple Heart recipients or 25 their surviving spouses, Medal of Honor recipients or their 26 27 surviving spouses, and former prisoners of war or their

surviving spouses shall receive additional distinctive license
plates or renewal decals, as the case may be, without payment
of registration fees or license taxes, including ad valorem
tax, for the additional motor vehicle provided that the other
requirements of this section are met."
Section 2. This act shall become effective on the

7 first day of the third month following its passage and
8 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
