16	To amend Section 34-23-1, Code of Alabama 1975, to
17	specifically authorize licensed pharmacists to dispense yellow
18	fever vaccines.
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Section 34-23-1, Code of Alabama 1975, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	"\$34-23-1.
23	"For the purpose of this chapter, the following
24	words and phrases shall have the following meanings:
25	"(1) ASSOCIATION. The Alabama Pharmacy Association.
26	"(2) BOARD or STATE BOARD. The Alabama State Board
27	of Pharmacy.

"(3) CHEMICAL. Any substance of a medicinal nature,
 whether simple or compound, obtained through the process of
 the science and art of chemistry, whether of organic or
 inorganic origin.

5 "(4) DISPENSE. To sell, distribute, administer,
6 leave with, give away, dispose of, deliver, or supply a drug
7 or medicine to the ultimate user or their agent.

"(5) DRUGS. All medicinal substances, preparations, 8 9 and devices recognized by the United States Pharmacopoeia and 10 National Formulary, or any revision thereof, and all substances and preparations intended for external and internal 11 12 use in the cure, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, or 13 prevention of disease in man or animal, and all substances and preparations other than food intended to affect the structure 14 15 or any function of the body of man or animal, and vaccines for yellow fever. 16

17 "(6) EXTERN. A candidate for licensure as a 18 pharmacist during the time prior to graduation from an 19 accredited college of pharmacy.

"(7) HOSPITAL. An institution for the care and treatment of the sick and injured, licensed by the Alabama State Board of Health and authorized to be entrusted with the custody of drugs and medicines, the professional use of drugs and medicines being under the direct supervision of a medical practitioner or pharmacist.

"(8) INTERN. An individual who is currently licensed
by this state to engage in the practice of pharmacy while

under the personal supervision of a pharmacist and is satisfactorily progressing toward meeting the requirements for licensure as a pharmacist; or a graduate of an approved college of pharmacy who is currently licensed by the State Board of Pharmacy for the purpose of obtaining practical experience as a requirement for licensure as a pharmacist; or a qualified applicant awaiting examination for licensure.

8 "(9) LEGEND DRUG. Any drug, medicine, chemical, or 9 poison bearing on the label the words, "caution, federal law 10 prohibits dispensing without prescription," or similar wording 11 indicating that such drug, medicine, chemical, or poison may 12 be sold or dispensed only upon the prescription of a licensed 13 medical practitioner.

"(10) LICENSE. The grant of authority by the State
Board of Pharmacy to a person authorizing him or her to engage
in the practice of pharmacy in this state.

"(11) MANUFACTURER. A person, except a pharmacy, who
prepares, derives, produces, compounds, or packages any drug,
medicine, chemical, or poison.

"(12) MEDICAL PRACTITIONER. Any physician, dentist,
or veterinarian, or any other person authorized by law to
treat, use, or prescribe medicine and drugs for sick and
injured human beings or animals in this state.

"(13) MEDICINE. Any drug or combination of drugs
that has the property of curing, diagnosing, preventing,
treating, or mitigating diseases or that which may be used for
those purposes.

"(14) PATENT OR PROPRIETARY MEDICINES. Completely 1 2 compounded nonprescription packaged drugs, medicines, and nonbulk chemicals which are sold, offered, promoted, or 3 4 advertised by the manufacturer or primary distributor under a trademark, trade name, or other trade symbol, and the labeling 5 of which conforms to the requirements of the Federal Food, 6 7 Drug, and Cosmetic Act; provided, that this definition shall not include: 8

9 "a. Drugs which are only advertised and promoted
10 professionally to licensed physicians, dentists, or
11 veterinarians by manufacturers or primary distributors.

12

"b. A narcotic or drug containing a narcotic.

13 "c. A drug the label of which bears substantially 14 either the statements "caution--federal law prohibits 15 dispensing without prescription" or "warning--may be 16 habit-forming".

17

"d. A drug intended for injection.

"(15) PERMIT. The grant of authority by the State 18 Board of Pharmacy to any person, firm, or corporation 19 authorizing the operation of a pharmacy, wholesale drug 20 21 distributor, repackager, bottler, manufacturer, or packer of 22 drugs, medicines, chemicals, or poisons for medicinal 23 purposes. Nonresident wholesale drug distributors registered with the appropriate agency, in the state in which they are 24 domiciled, and operating in compliance with Prescription Drug 25 Marketing Act standards, shall be allowed to do business in 26 27 this state. No permit shall be required of any physician

licensed to practice medicine for any act or conduct related
 to or connected with his or her professional practice.

3 "(16) PERSON. Any individual, partnership,
4 corporation, association, trust, or other entity.

5 "(17) PHARMACIST. Any person licensed by the Alabama 6 State Board of Pharmacy to practice the profession of pharmacy 7 in the State of Alabama and whose license is in good standing.

8 "(18) PHARMACY. A place licensed by the Alabama 9 State Board of Pharmacy in which prescriptions, drugs, 10 medicines, medical devices, chemicals, and poisons are sold, 11 offered for sale, compounded, or dispensed, and shall include 12 all places whose title may imply the sale, offering for sale, 13 compounding, or dispensing of prescriptions, drugs, medicines, 14 chemicals, or poisons.

15 "(19) POISON. Any substance other than agricultural 16 products and pesticides which when applied to, introduced 17 into, or developed within the body in relatively small 18 quantities by its inherent chemical action uniformly produces 19 serious bodily injury, disease, or death.

20 "(20) PRECEPTOR. A person who is duly licensed to 21 practice pharmacy in the state and meets the requirements as 22 established by the State Board of Pharmacy.

"(21) PRESCRIPTION. Any order for drug or medical
supplies, written or signed or transmitted by word of mouth,
telephone, telegraph, closed circuit television, or other
means of communication by a legally competent practitioner,
licensed by law to prescribe and administer such drugs and

medical supplies intended to be filled, compounded, or
 dispensed by a pharmacist.

3 "(22) PROFESSIONAL DEGREE. A degree in pharmacy
4 requiring a minimum of five academic years.

"(23) REPACKAGER. A person who purchases or acquires 5 6 from a manufacturer or distributor, a drug, medicine, 7 chemical, or poison for the purpose of bottling, labeling, or otherwise repackaging for sale or distribution. This 8 definition shall not apply to a physician licensed to practice 9 10 medicine who as a part of his or her professional practice dispenses, administers, sells, or otherwise distributes any 11 12 drug to a patient.

13 "(24) SALE. Barter, exchange, or gift, or offer of 14 barter, exchange, or gift, and shall include each transaction 15 made by any person, whether a principal, proprietor, agent, 16 servant, or employee.

17 "(25) WHOLESALE DRUG DISTRIBUTORS. A person engaged in the business of distributing drugs and medicines for resale 18 to pharmacies, hospitals, practitioners, government agencies, 19 or other lawful outlets permitted to sell drugs or medicines. 20 21 The sale, purchase, or trade of a drug by a retail pharmacy to 22 another retail pharmacy or practitioner, for relief of 23 temporary shortages, is exempt from this definition. Also 24 exempt from this definition shall be (a) intracompany sales, (b) manufacturer and distributor sales representatives who 25 distribute drug samples, (c) charitable organizations 26 distributing to nonprofit affiliates of that organization, (d) 27

1 certain purchases by hospitals or other health care entities
2 that are members of a group purchasing organization, and (e)
3 the distributors of blood and blood components."

4 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 5 first day of the third month following its passage and 6 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
