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11	To amend Section 22-50-17, Code of Alabama 1975,
12	relating to the care or treatment of mental or emotional
13	illness or services to mentally challenged persons; to exempt
14	from certification by the Department of Mental Health a
15	program or facility that exclusively provides inherently
16	religious services for the care of individuals who have
17	substance related disorders and operates under the authority
18	of an established church or other religious nonprofit
19	organization.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. Section 22-50-17, Code of Alabama 1975,
22	is amended to read as follows:
23	"§22-50-17.
24	"No (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this
25	section, no person, partnership, corporation, or association
26	of persons shall operate a facility or institution for the
27	care or treatment of any kind of mental or emotional illness_

1	substance related disorder, or intellectual disability or			
2	services to the mentally retarded as defined in this chapter,			
3	without being certified by the department or licensed by the			
4	State Board of Health; provided that nothing in this section			
5	shall be construed so as to require a duly authorized			
6	physician, psychiatrist, psychologist, social worker_ or			
7	Christian Science practitioner to obtain a license for			
8	certification by the department as an individual practitioner			
9	<u>in order to provide</u> treatment of patients in his <u>or her</u>			
10	private office, unless the services provided exceed the scope			
11	of practice consistent with the professional's license to			
12	<pre>practice or he or she keeps two or more patients in his or her</pre>			
13	office for continuous periods of 24 hours or more in one week,			
14	or both.			
15	"(b) For the purpose of subsection (c) of this			
16	section, the following terms shall have the following			
17	meanings:			
18	"(1) CARE. The provision of assistance and services			
19	that attend to clearly identified needs of individuals			
20	enrolled in a program.			
21	"(2) CLINICAL. Relating to, based on, or			
22	characterized by observable, diagnosable symptoms and course			
23	of a disease.			
24	"(3) ENTITY. A person, partnership, corporation, or			
25	association of persons.			
26	"(4) EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICES AND PROCEDURES.			
27	Effective approaches for prevention and treatment of substance			

1	related disorders that have been validated through		
2	professionally endorsed processes that include clinical trials		
3	and other scientific studies, professional consensus, or		
4	demonstrated efficacy over an acceptable period of time.		
5	"(5) FACILITY. The physical structure in which		
6	programs operate and services are provided.		
7	"(6) INHERENTLY RELIGIOUS. Based exclusively upon		
8	established beliefs, precepts, doctrine, practices, and/or		
9	teachings, regarding the existence, nature, and worship of a		
10	deity and deities, and of associated divine involvement in the		
11	universe and human life.		
12	"(7) INHERENTLY RELIGIOUS SERVICES. Interventions,		
13	strategies, and techniques used to provide care for		
14	individuals who have substance related disorders that are		
15	based exclusively on the beliefs, precepts, doctrine,		
16	practices, and teachings of a church or other nonprofit		
17	religious organization. These services shall consist of		
18	prayer, moral guidance, spiritual counseling, worship, study		
19	of sacred and other religious texts, religious instruction,		
20	proselytizing, and other exclusively religious activities.		
21	"(8) PROGRAM. An organized system of services made		
22	available to the general public for the care of individuals		
23	who have substance related disorders.		
24	"(9) SERVICES. Specific interventions, strategies,		
25	and techniques used to provide treatment and/or care for		
26	individuals who have substance related disorders.		

1	"(10) SUBSTANCE RELATED DISORDER. A set of symptoms			
2	related to the intake or use of alcohol and/or other drugs, t			
3	the side effects of a medication, or to toxin exposure, that			
4	incorporates the specific diagnostic criteria for			
5	Substance-Induced Disorders, Substance Abuse, and Substance			
6	Dependence, as defined by the most recent edition of the			
7	Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders of the			
8	American Psychiatric Association.			
9	"(c) Any program or facility operated by an			
10	established entity that utilizes, exclusively, inherently			
11	religious services to provide care for individuals who have			
12	substance related disorders shall be exempt from certification			
13	by the department as specified in subsection (a) of this			
14	section, subject to the department's assurance of compliance			
15	with the following requirements:			
16	"(1) The entity's services are conducted under the			
17	authority of an established church or other religious			
18	nonprofit organization of which the primary purpose is the			
19	propagation of inherently religious principles.			
20	"(2) The program and services provided by the entity			
21	are acknowledged as being inherently religious in the entity's			
22	articles of incorporation, charter, partnership agreement,			
23	bylaws, mission statement, goals and objectives, program			
24	description, or other official document.			
25	"(3) The program provides only inherently religious			
26	services in the provision of care for individuals with			
27	substance related disorders.			

1	"(4) The program does not employ a disease model of
2	care and does not provide any treatment services for substance
3	related disorders.
4	"(5) The program does not conduct clinical
5	assessments or assign clinical diagnoses for program
6	participants.
7	"(6) The program does not keep clinical records.
8	"(7) The entity does not hold its programs or
9	facilities out to be treatment programs or facilities for
10	individuals with substance related disorders or otherwise
11	market the care provided in its programs or facilities as
12	treatment services for substance related disorders.
13	"(d) Nothing in this section prohibits an employee
14	of the department from carrying out the duties of the
15	department as provided for in this title.
16	"(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed so
17	as to exempt any program or facility operated by an
18	established entity that utilizes, exclusively, inherently
19	religious services to provide care for individuals who have
20	substance related disorders from licensure, certification, or
21	compliance with any other requirements that are within the
22	scope of authority of the State Board of Health or any other
23	state or local regulatory body."
24	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
25	first day of the third month following its passage and
26	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
