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3	To amend Sections 20-3-2 and 20-3-3 of the Code of
4	Alabama 1975, authorizing legend drugs dispensed by
5	prescription to patients at certain health care facilities to
6	be donated and transferred to charitable clinics under certain
7	conditions; to authorize the drugs to be transferred in the
8	same manner to charitable pharmacies, as defined, to be
9	dispensed to charitable patients; and to further authorize
10	samples given to physicians to be donated and transferred to
11	charitable clinics and charitable pharmacies.
12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. Sections 20-3-2 and 20-3-3 of the Code of
14	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
15	"§20-3-2.
16	"As used in this chapter, the following terms shall
17	have the following meanings:
18	"(1) ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. An institution or
19	facility licensed as an assisted living facility under
20	regulations of the State Board of Health.
21	"(2) CHARITABLE CLINIC. The term includes an
22	established free medical clinic as defined in subdivision (1)
23	of Section 6-5-662 and any community health center provided
24	for under the federal Public Health Service Law.
25	"(3) CHARITABLE PATIENT. For purposes of this

chapter, the term shall not include patients who are eligible

to receive drugs under the Alabama Medicaid Program or under

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any other prescription drug program funded in whole or in part by the state or by the federal government.

"(4) CHARITABLE PHARMACY. A pharmacy, registered with the Board of Pharmacy as a retail pharmacy, that dispenses to charitable income patients who meet the criteria established by the Board of Pharmacy to receive free prescription medications that does not charge for pharmacy services or prescription medications and that does not dispense controlled substances. A charitable pharmacy may receive donated physician's samples.

"(4) (5) DRUGS. All medicinal substances and preparations recognized by the United States Pharmacopoeia and National Formulary, or any revision thereof, and all substances and preparations intended for external and internal use in the cure, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease and all substances and preparations other than food intended to affect the structure or any function of the body.

"(5) (6) HOSPICE CARE PROGRAM. A hospice care program licensed as a hospice care program under regulations of the State Board of Health.

" $\frac{(6)}{(7)}$ HOSPITAL. An institution licensed as a hospital under regulations of the State Board of Health.

"(7) (8) LEGEND DRUG. Any drug, medicine, chemical, or poison bearing on the label the words, "caution, federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription," or similar wording indicating that such drug, medicine, chemical, or

- poison may be sold or dispensed only upon the prescription of 1 2 a licensed medical practitioner. "(8) (9) NURSING FACILITY. An institution licensed 3 as a nursing facility or intermediate care facility under regulations of the State Board of Health. 5 "(9) (10) SPECIALTY CARE ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. 6 7 An institution or facility licensed as a specialty care assisted living facility under regulations of the State Board 8 9 of Health. 10 "\$20-3-3. "(a)(1) Legend drugs, except controlled substances, 11 12 dispensed but not administered to a patient in a hospital, 13 nursing facility, assisted living facility, or specialty care 14 assisted living facility may be donated and transferred pursuant to this section to a charitable clinic or charitable 15 pharmacy to be used by charitable patients free of charge when 16 17 all of the following conditions are met: "a. The drugs are no longer needed by the original 18 19 patient. "b. The drugs have been maintained in accordance 20 21 with United States Pharmacopoeia and National Formulary 22 storage requirements. 23 "c. The drugs were dispensed by unit dose or an 24 individually sealed dose.
- "d. The drugs have not expired.

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"(2) Legend drugs, except controlled substances, dispensed <u>but not administered</u> to a patient cared for by a

- 5 "a. The drugs are no longer needed by the original patient.
- 7 "b. The drugs were dispensed by unit dose or bulk packaging.
 - "c. The drugs have not expired.
 - "(b) The physician or licensed health care professional of the charitable clinic or charitable pharmacy shall be responsible for determining the suitability of the product for reuse. No product where integrity may not be assured shall be used by the physician at the charitable clinic or dispensed by a charitable pharmacy. A legend drug shall be assigned the expiration date stated on the package.
 - "(c) Pursuant to a voluntary agreement between a nursing home, hospital, specialty care assisted living facility, or hospice care program and a charitable clinic or charitable pharmacy, legend drugs may be transferred pursuant to this chapter from the nursing home, hospital, assisted living facility, or specialty care assisted living facility or from the residence of a hospice patient to the charitable clinic or charitable pharmacy if the following procedures are satisfied:

"(1) The legend drugs shall be physically
transferred to a person authorized in writing to pick up the
drugs for the charitable clinic or charitable pharmacy.

- "(2) The file of a patient at the nursing home, hospital, assisted living facility, or specialty care assisted living facility or the file of a patient cared for by a hospice care program shall document his or her consent, or in the case of the death of a patient the patient's family's consent, for the donation.
- "(3) The patient's name, prescription number, and any other identifying marks shall be obliterated from the drug container prior to removal from the nursing home, hospital, assisted living facility, or specialty care assisted living facility or the residence of a hospice patient.
- "(4) The name, strength, and expiration date of the legend drug shall remain on the medication package label.
- "(5) An inventory list of the legend drugs shall accompany the drugs being transferred, which list, at a minimum, shall contain for each drug the medication name, strength, expiration date, and quantity.
- "(6) Within one week after an inventoried list of legend drugs is made available, the drugs shall be picked up by a charitable clinic or charitable pharmacy, or the drugs shall be destroyed.
- "(d) A licensed nursing home, hospital, specialty care assisted living facility, assisted living facility, or hospice care program, or an owner, operator, employee, or

agent of a licensee, shall not be liable for civil damages or for any criminal liability as a result of any acts or omissions in transferring any drugs pursuant to this section unless the act or omission was the result of willful

misconduct.

- "(e) No pharmaceutical manufacturer shall be liable for any claim or injury arising due to a transfer of any legend drug pursuant to this chapter, including, but not limited to, liability for failure to transfer or communicate product or consumer information or the expiration date regarding the transferred drug.
 - "(f) The State Board of Health may make rules and regulations to carry out the provisions and purposes of this section.
 - "(g) All legend drugs distributed under the authority of this chapter shall be dispensed to a patient, resident, or other user only on the order of a licensed physician or other legally authorized licensed medical practitioner.
 - "(h) Samples of legend drugs, except for controlled substances, given to physicians may be donated and transferred to charitable clinics and charitable pharmacies to be dispensed to charitable patients without charge."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
