17		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
18		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
19		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
20		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
21		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
22		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
23		becoming effective with regard to a local
24		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
25		unless: it comes within one of a number of
26		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
27		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

13 AN ACT

Relating to lounges; to provide for the posting of the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline in certain establishments; to provide penalties; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) A licensee who is the owner or operator of any establishment that is licensed as a lounge pursuant to Title 28 of the Code of Alabama 1975, and has a

- liquor license or alcoholic beverage license, but does not also have a food or beverage permit, or both, shall post in a location conspicuous to the public at the place where the licensee carries on the business for which the license is granted, a poster of no smaller than 8 1/2 by 11 inches in size that states all of the following:
- "If you or someone you know is being forced to

 9 commercial sex, housework, farm work, or any other activity

- "(1) Victims of human trafficking are protected under U.S. law.
- 14 "(2) The Toll-free Hotline is:
- 15 "a. Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- "b. Operated by a nonprofit, nongovernmentalorganization.
- "c. Anonymous and confidential.
- "d. Accessible in 170 languages.
- "e. Able to provide help, referral to services, training, and general information."
- (b) The poster shall be available on the Internet
 website of the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board where
 documents associated with obtaining a liquor license or
 alcoholic beverage license are customarily located.

(c) The licensee shall print the poster from the Internet website of the board or ask the board to mail the poster for the cost of printing and first class postage.

- (d) The board shall post the sign on its Internet site in English and Spanish. The licensee shall obtain and post the posters in English, Spanish, and any other languages mandated by the Voting Rights Act in the county where the poster shall be posted. For all other languages mandated by the Voting Rights Act in the county where the poster shall be posted, the licensee shall request that the board translate the poster into that, or those, particular language and mail that, or those, particular posters to the licensee, where the licensee shall pay for the cost of printing and first class postage.
- (e) The board shall provide each licensee with notice of this act.
- (f) A first violation of this act shall be a Class C misdemeanor punishable by a fine or imprisonment, or both.

 Upon a second violation, the offense shall be a Class B misdemeanor punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both. Upon a third violation, the offense shall be a Class A misdemeanor punishable by a fine or imprisonment, or both.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of

the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
