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11	To amend Section 34-11-4, Code of Alabama 1975,
12	relating to the requirements for licensure for engineers and
13	land surveyors; to provide further for the graduation and
14	experience qualifications for licensure as a professional
15	engineer.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Section 34-11-4 of the Code of Alabama
18	1975, is amended to read as follows:
19	"\$34-11-4.
20	"The board may approve engineering, land surveying,
21	and related science programs which shall be accepted under the
22	following criteria:
23	"(1) PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER. The following shall be
24	considered as minimum evidence satisfactory to the board that
25	the applicant is qualified for licensure as a professional
26	engineer:
27	"a. Graduation and experience plus examination.

1 "1. Graduation in an approved engineering curriculum 2 plus four years experience. A graduate of an approved engineering curriculum of four years or more from a school or 3 4 college approved by the board who has successfully passed the eight-hour written examination in the fundamental engineering 5 6 subjects and who has a specific record of an additional four 7 years or more of progressive experience in engineering work of a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall be 8 admitted to an eight-hour written examination in the 9 10 principles and practice of engineering. Upon passing this examination, the applicant shall be granted a certificate of 11 12 licensure to practice engineering in this state, provided the 13 applicant is otherwise gualified.

"2. Graduation in an unapproved engineering 14 15 curriculum plus six years experience. A graduate of an unapproved engineering curriculum of four years or more who 16 17 has successfully passed the eight-hour written examination in the fundamental engineering subjects and who has a specific 18 record of an additional six years or more of progressive 19 experience in engineering work of a grade and character 20 21 satisfactory to the board shall be admitted to an eight-hour 22 written examination in the principles and practice of 23 engineering. Upon passing this examination, the applicant 24 shall be granted a certificate of licensure to practice 25 engineering in this state, provided the applicant is otherwise 26 qualified.

"3. Before December 31, 2015, an applicant who is a 1 graduate of an approved bachelor's engineering curriculum with 2 a doctorate in engineering plus four years' experience. A 3 graduate of an approved bachelor's engineering curriculum and 4 of an engineering doctorate program and who has a specific 5 record of four years or more of progressive experience in 6 7 engineering work of a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall be admitted to an eight-hour written examination 8 in the principles and practice of engineering. Upon passing 9 10 this examination, the applicant shall be granted a certificate 11 of licensure to practice engineering in this state, provided 12 the applicant is otherwise gualified.

"b. Comity. The board may, upon application, issue a 13 14 certificate of licensure as a professional engineer to any person who holds a valid professional engineering certificate 15 issued by any jurisdiction of the United States or of any 16 country; provided, that the education, experience, and 17 18 examination qualifications of the applicant are, in the judgment of the board, of a standard not lower than that 19 specified in the applicable licensure act in effect in Alabama 20 21 at the time such certificate was issued. The board may 22 authorize an applicant to practice engineering on a temporary basis upon issuance of an interim permit which shall remain in 23 24 effect until the board acts upon the application. The interim permit may be issued upon submission of documentation and a 25 fee which shall be established by the board, not to exceed 26 27 fifty dollars (\$50).

1 "(2) ENGINEER INTERN. The following shall be 2 considered as minimum evidence satisfactory to the board that 3 the applicant is qualified for certification as an engineer 4 intern:

5 "a. Graduation and examination. A graduate of an 6 approved engineering curriculum of four years or more from a 7 school or college approved by the board who has successfully 8 passed an eight-hour written examination in the fundamental 9 engineering subjects shall be certified as an engineer intern, 10 if otherwise qualified.

11 "b. Graduation and examination plus experience. 12 Graduation in an unapproved engineering curriculum plus two 13 years experience. A graduate of an unapproved engineering 14 curriculum of four years or more who has successfully passed 15 an eight-hour written examination in the fundamental engineering subjects and who has a specific record of two 16 17 years or more of progressive experience in engineering work of a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall be 18 certified as an engineer intern, if otherwise qualified. 19

"c. Comity. The education, experience, and examination qualifications of the applicant are, in the judgment of the board, of a standard not lower than that specified in the applicable licensure act in effect in Alabama at the time such certificate was issued. Fundamentals of engineering examinations of comparable character taken and passed in another jurisdiction may be accepted by the board.

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"(3) PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYOR. The following shall
 be considered as minimum evidence satisfactory to the board
 that the applicant is qualified for licensure as a
 professional land surveyor.

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"a. Graduation and experience plus examination.

"1. Graduation in an approved land surveying 6 7 curriculum plus four years experience. A graduate of an approved land surveying curriculum of four years or more 8 including a minimum of 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours 9 10 of surveying courses from a school or college approved by the board who has successfully passed an eight-hour written 11 12 examination in the fundamental land surveying subjects and who 13 has a specific record of an additional four years or more of 14 combined office and field experience in land surveying work of 15 a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall be admitted to a six-hour written examination in the principles 16 17 and practice of land surveying and a two-hour written examination on laws, procedures, and practices pertaining to 18 land surveying in Alabama. Upon passing these examinations, 19 the applicant shall be granted a certificate of licensure to 20 21 practice land surveying, provided the applicant is otherwise 22 qualified.

"2. Graduation in an approved curriculum related to
surveying plus six years experience. A graduate of a
curriculum related to surveying of four years or more
including a minimum of 15 semester hours or 22.5 quarter hours
of surveying courses from a school or college approved by the

1 board and who has successfully passed the eight-hour written 2 examination in the fundamental land surveying subjects and who has a specific record of an additional six years or more of 3 4 progressive office and field experience in land surveying work of a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall be 5 6 admitted to a six-hour examination in the principles and 7 practice of land surveying and a two-hour written examination of laws, procedures, and practices pertaining to land 8 9 surveying in Alabama. Upon passing these examinations, the 10 applicant shall be granted a certificate of licensure to practice land surveying in this state, provided the applicant 11 12 is otherwise gualified.

"3. Graduation in a related science curriculum plus 13 14 eight years experience. A graduate of a related science 15 curriculum of four years or more from a school or college approved by the board who has successfully passed the 16 17 eight-hour written examination in the fundamental land surveying subjects and who has a specific record of an 18 additional eight years or more of progressive combined office 19 and field experience in land surveying work of a grade and 20 21 character satisfactory to the board shall be admitted to a 22 six-hour examination in the principles and practice of land 23 surveying and a two-hour written examination of laws, 24 procedures, and practices pertaining to land surveying in 25 Alabama. Upon passing these examinations, the applicant shall 26 be granted a certificate of licensure to practice land

surveying in this state, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified.

"b. Experience plus examination. Before December 31, 3 4 2007, an applicant who has a specific record of eight years or more of combined office and field experience in land surveying 5 work of a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall 6 7 be admitted to an eight-hour written examination in the fundamentals of land surveying, and after passing the 8 fundamentals examination shall be admitted to a six-hour 9 10 written examination in the principles and practice of land surveying and a two-hour written examination on laws, 11 12 procedures, and practices pertaining to land surveying in 13 Alabama. Upon passing these examinations, the applicant shall 14 be granted a certificate of licensure to practice land 15 surveying in this state, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified. 16

17 "c. Comity. The board may, upon application, grant to any person who holds a valid professional land surveying 18 certificate issued by any jurisdiction of the United States or 19 of any country, admission into a two-hour written examination 20 21 of laws, procedures, and practices pertaining to land surveying in Alabama, provided that the education, experience, 22 23 and examination qualifications of the applicant are, in the judgment of the board, of a standard not lower than that 24 specified in the applicable licensure act in effect in Alabama 25 26 at the time such certificate was issued. Upon passing the 27 examination, the applicant shall be granted a certificate of

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licensure to practice land surveying in this state, provided
 the applicant is otherwise qualified.

3 "(4) LAND SURVEYOR INTERN. The following shall be
4 considered as minimum evidence satisfactory to the board that
5 the applicant is qualified for certification as a land
6 surveyor intern:

7 "a. Graduation plus examination. Graduation in an approved land surveying curriculum. A graduate of a land 8 surveying curriculum of four years or more including a minimum 9 10 of 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours of surveying courses from a school or college approved by the board who has 11 successfully passed an eight-hour written examination in the 12 13 fundamentals of land surveying shall be certified as a land surveyor intern, if otherwise qualified. 14

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"b. Graduation and examination plus experience.

"1. Graduation in an approved curriculum related to 16 17 surveying plus two years experience. A graduate of a curriculum related to surveying of four years or more 18 including a minimum of 15 semester hours or 22.5 guarter hours 19 of surveying courses from a school or college approved by the 20 21 board who has successfully passed an eight-hour written 22 examination in the fundamentals of land surveying and who has 23 a specific record of an additional two years or more of 24 combined office and field experience in land surveying work of 25 a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall be 26 certified as a land surveyor intern, if otherwise qualified.

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"2. Graduation in a related science curriculum plus 1 2 four years experience. A graduate of a related science curriculum of four years or more who has successfully passed 3 4 an eight-hour written examination in the fundamentals of land surveying and who has a specific record of an additional four 5 6 years or more of combined office and field experience in land 7 surveying work of a grade and character satisfactory to the board shall be certified as a land surveyor intern, if 8 otherwise qualified. 9

10 "c. Comity. The education, experience, and 11 examination qualifications of the applicant are, in the 12 judgment of the board, of a standard not lower than that 13 specified in the applicable licensure act in effect in Alabama 14 at the time such certificate was issued. The board may accept 15 fundamentals of land surveying examinations of comparable 16 character taken and passed in another jurisdiction.

17 "(5) CHARACTER. No person shall be eligible for 18 licensure as a professional engineer, certification as an 19 engineer intern, licensure as a professional land surveyor, or 20 certification as a land surveyor intern who is not of good 21 character and reputation.

"(6) TEACHING CREDITS. In considering the
qualifications of applicants, teaching in an engineering
curriculum approved by the board may be considered as
engineering experience. Teaching land surveying subjects in a
land surveying curriculum approved by the board may be
considered as land surveying experience.

"(7) GRADUATE STUDY. In counting years of experience 1 2 for professional engineer licensure, the board may give credit, not in excess of one year, for successful completion 3 4 of graduate study leading to a master's degree in engineering. If a Ph.D. in engineering is completed, a total of two year's 5 experience may be credited. The two-year credit shall include 6 7 one year for the master's degree. If the Ph.D. is obtained without the master's degree, the credit for experience shall 8 be two years. In counting years of experience for professional 9 10 land surveyor licensure, the board may give credit, not in excess of one year, for successful completion of graduate 11 12 study leading to a master's degree in land surveying. If a 13 Ph.D. in land surveying is completed, a total of two years' 14 experience may be credited. The credit of two years shall include one year for the master's degree. If the Ph.D. is 15 obtained without the master's degree, the credit for 16 17 experience shall be two years.

18 "(8) NONPRACTICING APPLICANTS. Any person having the 19 necessary qualifications prescribed in this chapter to entitle 20 the applicant to licensure shall be eligible for licensure 21 although the applicant may not be practicing engineering or 22 land surveying at the time of making application.

"(9) RECOGNITION OF PREVIOUSLY TAKEN EXAMINATIONS.
The board may accept fundamentals and principles and practice
examinations of comparable character taken and passed in
another jurisdiction."

Section 2. This act shall become effective
 immediately following its passage and approval by the
 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
