19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. The Legislature finds that considerable
21	disagreement exists in the state about charitable bingo, and
22	the Legislature desires to establish a commission with the
23	authority to issue state licenses to applicants who wish to
24	operate charitable bingo in the state.
25	Section 2. As used in this act, the following terms
26	shall have the following meanings:

1 (1) Commission. The Alabama Charitable Bingo 2 Licensure Commission created by this act.

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- 3 (2) License. A charitable bingo license issued by the Commission.
 - (3) Local Constitutional Amendment. Any amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, which authorizes charitable bingo to be played in a particular county or municipality.

Section 3. There is created the Alabama Charitable Bingo Licensure Commission. The Commission shall be composed of one member appointed by the Governor; one member appointed by the Attorney General; one member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; one member appointed by the Chief Justice of the State Supreme Court; one member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and one member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the House of Representatives. Members shall be appointed as soon as possible, but not later than twenty-one days following the effective date of this act. Members of the commission shall be residents of the State of Alabama and shall not have been convicted of a felony. No person actively engaged or having a direct pecuniary interest in charitable bingo activities shall be a member of the commission. No elected official shall be a member of the commission. Members shall serve without compensation but shall receive per diem and travel expenses in the same amount as state employees receive.

Section 4. The Commission shall appoint an executive director, who shall serve at the pleasure of the Commission.

The Commission shall set the salary of the executive director.

The executive director may, at his or her discretion, and without regard to the State Merit System Law, appoint additional personnel as may be necessary to carry out the

duties and functions of the Commission.

Section 5. (a) No person shall be authorized to conduct charitable bingo in the state until the person first receives a license from the Commission.

- (b) The Commission shall set appropriate fees for issuing licenses. Fees collected by the Commission shall be used to fund the operations of the Commission. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010, any fees received are hereby appropriated to the Commission.
- (c) Prior to issuing any license, the Commission shall do all of the following:
- (1) Inspect and examine the application to determine whether or not the applicant proposes to operate charitable bingo that is in compliance with the local constitutional amendment applicable to the location at which the applicant proposes to operate charitable bingo.
- (2) Inspect and examine all equipment and devices that the applicant proposes to use in operating charitable bingo to determine whether or not such equipment and devices are in compliance with the applicable local constitutional

amendment and any case law governing the operation of charitable bingo in the state.

(d) If satisfied that a person is eligible to receive a license to conduct charitable bingo, and upon the payment of the applicable license fee to the Commission, the Commission shall issue a license to the person, and the person shall be authorized to conduct charitable bingo.

Section 6. The Commission may deny any application and may revoke, suspend, or limit any license previously issued by the Commission. The decisions made by the Commission shall be final and shall not be subject to administrative review. Any challenges to the decisions made by the Commission shall be made in the circuit court of Montgomery County.

Section 7. The Commission shall be exempt from the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act for one year following the effective date of this act.

Section 8. The provisions of this act shall terminate and the Commission shall be dissolved upon the establishment by statute or constitutional amendment of a statewide gaming commission.

Section 9. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor or its otherwise becoming law.
