2 Section 47 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, 3 is amended to read as follows:

"Section 47.

"(a) Senators shall be at least twenty-five years of age, and representatives twenty-one years of age at the time of their election. They shall have been citizens and residents of this state for three years and residents of their respective counties or districts for one year next before their election, if such county or district shall have been so long established; but if not, then of the county or district from which the same shall have been taken; and they shall reside in their respective counties or districts during their terms of office.

"(b) Each candidate for the Alabama Senate or

Alabama House of Representatives shall have a minimum credit
score of 650 as reported by a nationally recognized consumer
credit reporting agency.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the

following description of the substance or subject matter of 1 2 the proposed constitutional amendment: "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 3 Alabama of 1901, to require each candidate for a seat in the 4 5 Alabama Senate or Alabama House of Representatives shall have a minimum credit score of 650 as reported by a nationally 6 7 recognized consumer credit reporting agency.
