20	To amend Section 36-26-35, Code of Alabama 1975,
21	relating to the accumulation of leave by state employees, to
22	provide that state employees may be entitled to receive
23	payment for any accrued and unused annual leave days in excess
24	of 60 days, up to a maximum of 10 days per year.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 36-26-35, Code of Alabama 1975,
27	is amended to read as follows:

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"§36-26-35.

2 "(a) All persons who are regularly employed by the state and who are subject to the provisions of the state Merit 3 4 System, and all legislative personnel, officers, and employees, including, but not limited to, Legislative Reference Ser-5 6 vice personnel, whether subject to the state Merit System or 7 not, shall be entitled to accumulate annual leave on the basis of biweekly pay periods through the payday on March 17, 2006, 8 as follows: 9

"Employee's total Accumulation of 10 service with: leave per pay period Annual Accumulation 11 12 Fewer than five 4 hours 13 days years' service 13 14 Five but less than 5 hours 16 days 2 hours 15 10 years' service 10 but less than 6 hours 19 days 4 hours 16 15 years' service 17 15 but less than 7 hours 18 22 days 6 hours 19 20 years' service 20 20 but less than 8 hours 26 days 21 25 years' service 22 25 years of ser-9 hours 29 days 2 hours 23 vice or more

1 "(b) Beginning with the payday on April 3, 2006, all persons who are regularly employed by the state and who are 2 subject to the provisions of the state Merit System, and all 3 legislative personnel, officers, and employees, including, but 4 not limited to, Legislative Reference Service personnel, 5 6 whether subject to the state Merit System or not, shall be en-7 titled to accumulate annual leave on the basis of semi-monthly pay periods as follows: 8

"(c) Maximum accrued leave after 25 years of service
shall be limited to 29 1/4 days per year, and the maximum
number of days of annual leave which may be carried over at
the end of each year shall be limited to 60 days.

5 "(d) Any law enforcement officer in the Department 6 of Public Safety shall be entitled to receive payment for any 7 accrued and unused annual leave days in excess of 60 days, up 8 to a maximum of 10 days per year. Payment shall be calculated 9 using the officer's regular rate of pay.

"(e) Except as provided in subsection (d), all 10 11 persons who are regularly employed by the state and who are 12 subject to the state Merit System, and all legislative 13 personnel, officers, and employees, including, but not limited 14 to, Legislative Reference Service personnel, whether subject 15 to the state Merit System or not, may be entitled to receive 16 payment for any accrued and unused annual leave days in excess of 60 days, up to a maximum of 10 days per year, provided, 17 however that proration has not been declared. Payment shall be 18 19 calculated using the employee's regular rate of pay; provided, however, no department, agency, board, or commission of the 20 21 state may make such payments if the payment causes a 22 department, agency, board, or commission to be unable to pay 23 merit raises to its employees. Each department, agency, board, or commission shall have the sole authority and discretion to 24 25 determine to pay zero days of accrued and unused annual leave in excess of 60 days, or any amount of additional days deemed 26

1	appropriate, not to exceed 10 days provided all qualifying
2	employees in each department, agency, board, or commission are
3	treated equally."
4	Section 2. This act shall become effective

5 immediately following its passage and approval by the

6 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
