Also under the School Fiscal Accountability 12 13 Act, the position of custodian of school funds is abolished and the newly created position of chief 14 15 school financial officer is required to verify payments of all local board of education funds upon 16 17 written order of the local superintendent of 18 education. 19 This bill would make optional the 20 requirement that a local board of education publish 21 financial statements, now available on the 22 Internet, in the local newspaper. 23 This bill would also delete the requirement 24 that payrolls be signed by the chair of the local 25 board of education. 26 27 A BILL

"The city board of education shall may publish 14 15 annually in the month of October November in a newspaper published in said city, if there is a newspaper published in 16 17 said city, a full and complete statement of the receipts by source and disbursements by function of the city for the 12 18 months' period ending September 30, in such form as is 19 20 required by the State Superintendent of Education at the same 21 time it forwards said statement to the State Superintendent of 22 Education. The city board of education shall also publish 23 annually in a newspaper published in said city, if there is a 24 newspaper published in said city, in the month of October, a 25 statement of the outstanding indebtedness of the board of 26 education on last September 30, which statement must show the 27 schedule by years for retiring said indebtedness and shall

1 separate funded indebtedness from unfunded indebtedness, and 2 the statement shall show the resources available to pay such unfunded indebtedness. The city board of education may also 3 4 cause to be prepared and published annually in sufficient quantities for distribution among the citizens of the county a 5 report covering the condition, current accomplishments and 6 7 needs for the improvement of the schools. The refusal or negligent failure of any member of the city board of education 8 to comply with the provisions of this section shall constitute 9 10 a misdemeanor, and the State Superintendent of Education shall withhold the payment of public school funds until the 11 12 provisions of this section have been complied with."

15 Section 3. This act shall become effective on July 16 1, 2010, following its passage and approval by the Governor, 17 or its otherwise becoming law.
