This bill would also require a 13 convicted sex offender to place a sign at his or 14 her residence stating "No candy or treats at this 15 residence" and to leave all outside lights turned off. 16 17 Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 18 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the 19 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 20 21 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a 22 new or increased expenditure of local funds from 23 becoming effective with regard to a local 24 governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote 25 unless: it comes within one of a number of 26 specified exceptions; it is approved by the 27 affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

1 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 2 the entity for the purpose. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 3 4 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) shall beguilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its 16 17 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 18 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 19 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 20 21 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 22 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 23 existing crime.

24 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 25 first day of the third month following its passage and 26 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
