Section 16-23-5 of the Code of Alabama 6 7 1975, is amended to read as follows: "§16-23-5. 8 "(a) The State Superintendent of Education shall 9 10 have authority to revoke any certificate issued under the 11 provisions of this chapter when the holder has been quilty of 12 immoral conduct or unbecoming or indecent behavior. "(b) If the superintendent receives a written 13 complaint alleging that a certificate holder has engaged in 14 immoral conduct or unbecoming or indecent behavior pursuant to 15 subsection (a), and determines that an investigation is 16 17 warranted, the superintendent, not more than 10 days after the 18 initiation of the investigation, shall notify and provide a 19 copy of the written complaint to the certificate holder. "(c) The superintendent may not place the name of a 20 21 certificate holder on any registry indicating certification 22 action, take any action impairing the ability of a certificate holder to obtain employment, or take any other action 23 impairing a certificate issued under this chapter until the 24 certificate holder has exhausted all due process rights, 25 including any appeals." 26

Section 2. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
