19	relating to the duties of the Joint Transportation Committee;

21	administrative hearing involving a civil dispute or conflict
22	between the department and any private business person or
23	entity.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 29-2-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is
26	amended to read as follows:
27	"\$29-2-4.

"<u>(a)</u> The powers and duties of the Joint
 Transportation Committee shall be the following:

"(1) It shall review and concur in a long-range 3 4 (five-year) federal-aid highway plan for proposed highway construction of all highways on the state highway system, 5 which long-range plan shall commence with the fiscal year of 6 7 the state beginning October 1, 1989. Prior to any deviation from the intent of the five-year plan, the Joint 8 Transportation Committee shall review and concur in the 9 10 deviation, except commitments for highway projects necessary for new or expanded industry. Commitments for these industry 11 12 projects shall be included in the next quarterly report by the 13 Department of Transportation. The plan shall be updated annually. The plans in appropriate form shall be made 14 15 available to all government agencies and all members of the 16 public and news media.

17 "(2) The review and concurrence in annual update of the five-year highway plan shall be accomplished by the Joint 18 19 Transportation Committee prior to September 1 each year. 20 Failure of the Joint Transportation Committee to concur in the 21 annual update will not prevent the Department of 22 Transportation from proceeding with any project The Department of Transportation shall not proceed with any program or 23 project prior to the express approval of the program or 24 25 project by the Joint Transportation Committee. 26 "(3) It shall review the budget for highway

26 "(3) It shall review the budget for highway
 27 construction, maintenance, operation, and administration of

the Department of Transportation on an annual basis, which
 budget shall be reviewed not later than the fifteenth
 legislative day of each annual session of the Legislature.

4 "(4) It shall issue a report to the Governor,
5 Lieutenant Governor, House of Representatives, Senate, and
6 public within the first 10 legislative days of each annual
7 regular legislative session, comparing actual performance of
8 the Department of Transportation in terms of highway
9 construction, maintenance, and costs of the same, to the
10 original plan for the immediate preceding fiscal year.

"(5) It shall recommend to the Governor necessary funding for Department of Transportation budgets to the extent necessary beyond funds already provided by law.

"(6) It may retain the services of outside
consultants, if necessary, and consult with other groups and
individuals, including public interest groups, interested
individuals, and appropriate departments of the University of
Alabama, Auburn University, and other state institutions.

19 "(7) It may hold public hearings, shall make 20 diligent inquiry and a full examination of the long-range 21 future highway needs of the state, and shall file all reports 22 of its findings and recommendations with both houses of the 23 Legislature and with the Governor.

"(8) It may call witnesses and do all things
necessary or convenient in connection with and all things
incidental to performance of the foregoing duties and powers.

1	"(9) In performing its functions, the Joint
2	Transportation Committee shall take into consideration, in
3	determining plans for highway construction and maintenance,
4	among other factors all of the following:
5	"a. Commuter benefits in the form of direct savings
6	to working men and women traveling to and from their jobs in
7	the state.
8	"b. Industrial and agricultural growth, including
9	specifically, practices and policies of the Department of
10	Transportation that will facilitate the industrial development
11	efforts of private businesses that seek readily available
12	access to state roads and highways.
13	"c. Transportation safety.
14	"d. Ecological impacts of transportation projects.
15	"e. Recreation and tourism.
16	"f. Traffic density.
17	" <u>(b)(1) The committee shall have the additional</u>
18	power to call for and conduct administrative hearings and to
19	issue advisory opinions regarding conflicts or civil disputes
20	between the Alabama Department of Transportation and private
21	business individuals and entities.
22	" <u>(2) In any administrative hearing conducted by the</u>
23	committee, the committee may compel the attendance of
24	witnesses and the providing of documents and data necessary
25	for the committee to conduct its hearings.
26	" <u>(3) The committee shall strive to conduct any</u>
27	administrative hearing consistent with concepts of judicial

1	equity and may follow guidelines provided by the Alabama
2	Center for Dispute Resolution; however, the committee shall
3	not be required to adhere to such guidelines.
4	"(4) After hearing all testimony and reviewing all
5	pertinent testimony and facts of the dispute, the committee
6	shall issue an advisory opinion.
7	"(5) The causes of action and remedies provided in
8	this act are not intended to be the exclusive remedies
9	available to a consumer or injured party, nor must the
10	consumer or injured party exhaust any administrative remedies
11	provided under this act or any other applicable law."
12	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
13	first day of the third month following its passage and
14	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
