"Each member of the board shall be a citizen of the 8 United States and a resident of this state, and either a 9 10 licensed professional engineer or licensed professional land surveyor who exclusively holds either an unexpired certificate 11 12 under this chapter to practice as a licensed professional engineer or an unexpired certificate to practice as a licensed 13 14 professional land surveyor, who has been engaged in the 15 practice of engineering or land surveying, respectively, for at least 12 years, and who has been in responsible charge of 16 17 important engineering or land surveying, respectively, work for at least five years." 18

Section 2. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
