local boards of education regarding any vaccination
 requirements to contain information on grounds for
 exemption from the requirements.

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This bill would require local superintendents of education to make monthly reports to the State Superintendent of Education regarding reports pertaining to violations of this bill's provisions.

This bill would require a reduction in Foundation Program Fund monies for violations.

Under existing law, there is no requirement that students of public two-year and four-year institutions of higher education receive vaccinations, but several of these institutions require vaccinations for admission for students.

16 This bill would require public two-year and 17 four-year institutions of higher education that 18 require vaccinations for students to provide 19 exemptions to those requirements.

This bill would require communications to students and parents of minor students from public two-year and four-year institutions of higher education regarding any vaccination requirements to contain information on grounds for exemption from the requirements.

"The provisions of this chapter shall not apply if 16 17 when either of the following are true: "(1) In the absence of an epidemic or immediate 18 19 threat thereof, the The parent or guardian of the child shall 20 object thereto objects in writing on grounds that such the 21 immunization or testing conflicts with his or her religious 22 tenets and practices or sincerely held personal beliefs.; or 23 "(2) Certification by a A competent medical 24 authority providing provides certification for an individual 25 exemption from the required immunization or testing is

26 presented to the admissions officer of the school."

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1 Section 3. (a) Any communication provided to 2 students or parents by a public PreK-12 school or local board of education regarding immunization requirements shall include 3 information describing the circumstances under which an 4 5 exemption from the immunization requirements as provided in Section 16-30-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is permitted. The 6 7 exemption information and immunization requirements shall be provided in the same font, size, and style, and located on the 8 9 same page of the written or digital communication.

10 (b) (1) The State Board of Education shall develop a 11 standardized complaint form for violations of subsection (a) 12 by public PreK-12 schools or local boards of education and 13 shall include instructions for how complaints should be filed 14 with a local superintendent of education.

(2) Complaint forms shall be made accessible on the
websites of local boards of education and the State Board of
Education.

18 (c) (1) Each local superintendent of education shall 19 report monthly to the State Superintendent of Education the 20 names of those schools located under his or her jurisdiction 21 for which he or she has both received and verified reports of 22 violations of subsection (a).

(2) Each local superintendent of education shall
 also report monthly to the State Superintendent of Education
 regarding instances of received and verified reports of
 violations of subsection (a) by the local board of education.

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(d) (1) If a public PreK-12 school violates 1 2 subsection (a), the State Superintendent of Education shall reduce by one thousand dollars (\$1,000), for the succeeding 3 fiscal year, the portion of that local board of education's 4 5 allotment from the Foundation Program Fund to which that school would otherwise be entitled, per violation. The 6 7 reduction shall only apply to the violating school and 8 sufficient safequards shall be implemented to ensure that the 9 reduction does not decrease or supplant funding to any other 10 school under the jurisdiction of the local board of education. (2) If a local board of education violates 11 12 subsection (a), the State Superintendent of Education shall 13 reduce by one thousand dollars (\$1,000), in the succeeding fiscal year, that local board of education's allotment from 14 the Foundation Program Fund, per violation. 15 Section 4. (a) (1) A public two-year or four-year 16 17 institution of higher education that requires a student to 18 receive a vaccination shall provide an exemption to a student if either of the following are true: 19 20 a. The student objects in writing on grounds that 21 the vaccination conflicts with his or her religious tenets and practices or sincerely held religious beliefs. 22 23 b. A competent medical authority provides 24 certification for an individual exemption from the required 25 vaccination.

26 (2) Any communication provided to students or
 27 parents of students by a public two-year or four-year

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institution of higher education regarding vaccination
requirements shall include information describing the
circumstances under which an exemption from its vaccination
requirements is permitted. The exemption information and
vaccination requirements shall be provided in the same font,
size, and style, and located on the same page of the written
or digital communication.

8 (b)(1) The boards of trustees of each public 9 two-year or four-year institution of higher education shall 10 develop a standardized complaint form for violations of 11 subsection (a) by those institutions, and shall include 12 instructions for how complaints should be filed with the 13 boards of trustees.

14 (2) Complaint forms shall be made accessible on the
 15 websites of the boards of trustees of each public two-year or
 16 four-year institution of higher education.

(c) If a public two-year or four-year institution of higher education violates this section, state funding for that institution shall be reduced by one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per violation in the succeeding fiscal year.

(d) It is the intent of the Legislature that
constitutionally created boards of trustees comply with the
requirements of this section.

24 Section 5. When auditing a public PreK-12 school or 25 a public two-year or four-year institution of higher 26 education, the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts

1	shall include in the audit report any violations of Section
2	16-30-3, Code of Alabama 1975, or Sections 1 through 4.
3	Section 6. This act shall become effective on the
4	first day of the third month following its passage and
5	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
