SYNOPSIS: Under existing general law, the term of the Revenue Commissioner of Cullman County commences on October 1 following election at the general election in November of the prior calendar year.

This bill would propose a local amendment to the Constitutional of Alabama of 1901, relating to Cullman County, to provide that the term of office of the Revenue Commissioner would commence on December 1 following the general election in 2026, and every six years thereafter. The term of the office of the incumbent revenue commissioner would expire on November 30, 2026.

A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

To propose a local amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, relating to Cullman County, to provide that the term of office of the Revenue Commissioner would commence

1 on December 1 following the general election in 2026, and  
2 every six years thereafter; and to provide that the term of  
3 the office of the incumbent revenue commissioner would expire  
4 on November 30, 2026.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

6 Section 1. The following amendment to the  
7 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become  
8 valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of  
9 this act are fulfilled:

10 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

11 Effective beginning the next term of office after  
12 the ratification of this amendment, the Revenue Commissioner  
13 of Cullman County shall take office on December 1 following  
14 the general election in November 2026, and every six years  
15 thereafter. In order to implement the change in the  
16 commencement of the term of the revenue commissioner provided  
17 above, the term of the Revenue Commissioner serving on the  
18 ratification of the amendment shall expire on November 30,  
19 2026. The revenue commissioner shall continue to serve until a  
20 successor is elected and qualified.

21 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment  
22 shall be held in the general election in 2022 in accordance  
23 with Section 284.01 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,  
24 now appearing as Section 284.01 of the Official ReCompilation  
25 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the  
26 election laws of this state.

1                   Section 3. The appropriate election official shall  
2 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional  
3 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the  
4 following description of the substance or subject matter of  
5 the proposed constitutional amendment:

6                   "Relating to Cullman County; proposing an amendment  
7 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that the  
8 term of office of the Revenue Commissioner would commence on  
9 December 1 following the general election in 2026, and every  
10 six years thereafter; and to provide that the term of the  
11 office of the incumbent revenue commissioner would expire on  
12 November 30, 2026.
