SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, privately owned sewer systems, with certain exceptions, are regulated by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management with regard to sewage treatment, but are not regulated by the Public Service Commission with regard to rates and consumer protection.

This bill proposes a local constitutional amendment for Tuscaloosa County, to bring certain privately owned sewer systems that use public rights-of-way of public roads in the city limits of Lake View under the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission.

A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

To propose a local constitutional amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, for Tuscaloosa County, relating to privately owned sewer systems; to bring certain

1 privately owned sewer systems that use public rights-of-way of  
2 public roads in the city limits of Lake View under the  
3 jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

5 Section 1. The following amendment to the  
6 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become  
7 valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of  
8 this act are fulfilled:

9 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

10 (a) This amendment shall apply only in Tuscaloosa  
11 County.

12 (b) Any privately owned plant, property, or facility  
13 used for the collection, treatment, or disposal of sewage that  
14 uses, directly or through a lease or contract, public  
15 rights-of-way of public roads for any part of its collection  
16 or disposal system and that has residential or commercial  
17 customers located in the city limits of Lake View in  
18 Tuscaloosa County that are billed a flat service fee or fee  
19 based on water usage shall be certified and regulated by the  
20 Public Service Commission in relation to all of the customers  
21 of the entity located in the city limits of Lake View and in  
22 the unincorporated areas of Tuscaloosa County.

23 Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment  
24 and contingent upon the ratification of the Constitution of  
25 Alabama of 2022, the Code Commissioner shall number and place  
26 this amendment as appropriate in the constitution based upon a  
27 logical sequence and the particular subject or topic of the

1 amendment. In this amendment, the Code Commissioner may change  
2 capitalization, spelling, and punctuation for the purpose of  
3 style and uniformity; correct manifest grammatical, clerical,  
4 and typographical errors; and correct incorrect  
5 cross-references. When publishing the Constitution of Alabama  
6 of 2022, as amended, the Code Commissioner may omit this  
7 instructional paragraph.

8 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment  
9 shall be held in accordance with Section 284.01 of the  
10 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section  
11 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of  
12 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this  
13 state.

14 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall  
15 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional  
16 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the  
17 following description of the substance or subject matter of  
18 the proposed constitutional amendment:

19 "Relating to Tuscaloosa County, proposing an  
20 amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to bring  
21 certain privately owned sewer systems that use public  
22 rights-of-way of public roads in the city limits of Lake View  
23 under the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission.

24 "Proposed by Act \_\_\_\_\_"

25 This description shall be followed by the following  
26 language:

27 "Yes ( ) No ( )."
