1 SB147 2 3 4 ENROLLED, An Act, 5 Relating to meetings of governmental bodies; to 6 amend Section 36-25A-5.1, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to meetings of governmental bodies by electronic means, to 7 8 further provide for the participation by members of a governmental body at a meeting held by electronic means; to 9 10 provide further for public participation at a meeting held by 11 electronic means; to add Section 36-25A-5.2 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for electronic attendance at meetings 12 13 of local governmental bodies by members and the public; and to 14 make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the 15 existing code language to current style. 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 17 Section 1. Section 36-25A-5.1, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 18 "§36-25A-5.1. 19 20 "(a)(1) Except as provided in subsection (d), 21 members of a governmental body as defined in Section 36-25A-2, 22 that is comprised of members from two or more counties, may 23 participate in a meeting of that governmental body by means of 24 telephone conference, video conference, or other similar 25 communications equipment which allows all persons

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1 participating in the meeting to hear each other at the same 2 time. Participation by such these electronic means shall constitute presence in person at the meeting for all purposes  $\overline{r}$ 3 except for the establishment of a quorum; provided, that at 4 5 least three members, or a majority of a quorum of members, 6 whichever is less, are physically present at the physical 7 meeting location required by subsection (b). 8 "(2) If a member is participating in a meeting of a 9 governmental body by electronic means as authorized in this 10 section, the governmental body shall ensure that means of 11 access to the electronic communication is published in the same manner as the notice of the meeting is published pursuant 12 13 to this chapter. 14 "(3) The means of access shall allow members of the 15 public to hear the meeting. A governmental body is not 16 required to allow the public to participate by electronic 17 means to any extent beyond being able to hear the meeting. 18 "(b) Every meeting shall have one physical location 19 available for persons wishing to be physically present, at which any interested member of the public shall be able to 20 21 hear all persons who are participating remotely, and that 22 location shall be published in a manner consistent with this 23 chapter. 24 "(c) Utilization Except as otherwise provided by

25 this section, use of electronic communication shall be done in

1	a manner that complies with this chapter and allowing members
2	of the public to be present at the physical location required
3	by subsection (b) is sufficient for compliance with this
4	chapter and the electronic communication does not have to be
5	otherwise made available to members of the public.
6	"(d) The members of the following governmental
7	bodies are prohibited from participating in meetings and
8	deliberation via electronic communications as otherwise
9	authorized by this section:
10	" <u>(1)</u> The Board of Pardons and Paroles, the.
11	" <u>(2) The</u> Public Service Commission, standing.
12	" <u>(3) Standing</u> committees of the Legislature while
13	the Legislature is in session <del>, a<u>.</u></del>
14	"(4) A governing board taking any action under the
15	Students First Act of 2011 <del>, any<u>.</u></del>
16	" <u>(5) Any</u> state board or agency acting in any quasi
17	judicial capacity involving employment actions or the
18	promulgation adoption of rules pursuant to statutory
19	authority <del>, any<u>.</u></del>
20	" <u>(6) Any</u> state board, agency, or other governmental
21	body conducting a hearing which could result in loss of
22	licensure or professional censure, and the.
23	" <u>(7) The</u> Alabama Ethics Commission.
24	" <del>(e) Any other provision of this section to the</del>
25	contrary notwithstanding, a majority of a quorum of the

members participating in any given meeting shall be physically present at the location noticed and called for the meeting in order to conduct any business or deliberation, and only those members who are physically present may participate in an executive session of the governmental body.

6 "(f)(e) Any vote taken at a meeting utilizing the 7 equipment contemplated by subsection (a) shall be taken as a 8 roll call vote that allows each participant to vote 9 individually in a manner audible to all persons participating 10 or present at the physical location provided for in subsection 11 (b).

"(g) No member utilizing this section (f) A member 12 13 participating in a meeting by means provided by this section 14 shall may not claim any form of reimbursement for expenses 15 relating to that meeting, including mileage and per diem. 16 "(g) If the electronic communications fail or are in 17 any way interrupted during a meeting otherwise in compliance with this chapter, that failure shall not be grounds to 18 challenge any action taken during the meeting. 19

"(h) Any governmental body <u>comprised of members from</u>
<u>two or more counties</u> with specific statutory or constitutional
authority to meet via electronic means under a procedure
different than that set forth in this section may continue to
operate under the requirements of that specific authority or

1 may adopt a resolution opting to come under the requirements 2 of this section."

3 Section 2. Section 36-25A-5.2 is added to the Code
4 of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

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§36-25A-5.2.

6 (a) Any governmental body as defined in Section 36-25A-2 that is of a county or a municipality or is an entity 7 8 established by or whose members are appointed by a county or 9 municipality may allow participation in a meeting of that 10 governmental body by means of telephone conference, video 11 conference, or other similar communications equipment that allows all participants to hear one another at the same time; 12 13 provided, that both of the following are fulfilled:

14 (1) No less than a quorum of the members of the
15 governmental body are physically present at the physical
16 location required by subsection (d).

17 (2) The members of the body participating by
18 electronic means as provided in this section are unable to be
19 physically present at the meeting due to illness.

20 (b) Participation by electronic means as authorized 21 in this section shall constitute presence in person at the 22 meeting for all purposes, except for the establishment of a 23 quorum.

(c) At least 45 days before the first meeting that a
 governmental body uses electronic means of communication as

authorized by this section, the body shall adopt an electronic meeting policy detailing the procedures and communications equipment that will be used, how the public may access the meeting, and how voting will be conducted.

5 (d) Each meeting in which members of a governmental 6 body are participating by electronic means as authorized in 7 this section shall be held at a physical location available 8 for persons wishing to be physically present, at which any 9 interested member of the public shall be able to hear all 10 persons who are participating remotely.

(e) Any vote taken at a meeting utilizing the equipment authorized by subsection (a) shall be taken as a roll call vote that allows each participant to vote individually in a manner audible to all persons participating or present at the physical location provided for in subsection (d).

(f) A member participating in a meeting by electronic means as provided by this section may not claim any form of reimbursement for expenses relating to that meeting, including mileage.

21 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 22 first day of the third month following its passage and 23 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
