9		Commission provides qualified victims of violent
10		crimes financial benefits for eligible expenses,
11		including funeral costs, medical treatment,
12		counseling, sexual assault exams, travel, and
13		economic loss.
14		Under existing law, the Alabama Crime
15		Victims Compensation Commission meets monthly to
16		determine the eligibility for all compensation
17		claims above \$2,000.
18		Under existing law, the executive director
19		determines the eligibility for all compensation
20		claims of \$2,000 and below.
21		This bill would allow the executive director
22		to determine the eligibility of all compensation
23		claims and approve payments daily to increase
24		efficiency and expedite payments to victims of
25		violent crimes.

Sections 15-23-4 and 15-23-5, Code of 22 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "\$15-23-4. 23 24 "(a) There is hereby created the The Alabama Crime 25 Victims Compensation Commission, which is created and shall be 26 composed of three citizens residents of the State of Alabama

this state, who shall be appointed by the Governor with the

advice and consent of the Senate, for terms of four years each 1 2 or until their successors are appointed and qualified. Provided however, initial appointments shall be as follows: 3 One member shall be appointed for two years, one member shall 5 be appointed for three years, and one member shall be appointed for four years. All appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the duration of the unexpired term and subsequent 8 appointments shall be for four-year terms. The membership of 9 the board shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, 10 geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state and the Governor shall coordinate his or her appointments so 11 that the diversity of gender, race, and geographical areas is 12 13 reflective of the makeup of this state.

"(b) At least one member shall be a law enforcement officer with a minimum of 10 years' experience in or with a law enforcement agency which has among its primary duties and responsibilities the investigation of violent crimes and the apprehension or arrest of the perpetrators thereof.

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"(c) At least one member shall be a victim of a crime of violence who suffered serious personal injury as a result thereof of the crime, or a member of such a victim's immediate family or a member of a deceased victim's immediate family if such the deceased victim died as a result of a crime of violence, or an officer of a nonprofit, charitable crime victims organization established pursuant to the laws of Alabama.

"(d) Each year the commission shall elect a chairman
chair from its membership.

- "(e) The commission may appoint an executive director who shall serve at the pleasure of the commission and shall be paid a salary in an amount to be determined by the commission.
- "(f) The commission shall have its principal place of business in the county wherein where the State Capitol is located.
 - "(g) The commission shall <u>quarterly</u> hold, at its principal place of business regular monthly public meetings on the second Thursday of each month and other meetings at such times and places as its members may elect.
 - "(h) Any two members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for purposes of transacting the business of the commission and two votes in favor shall be necessary for a decision by the commission at any meeting of the commission.
 - "(i) From time to time the <u>The</u> commission shall establish rules and regulations for the administration of its duties and responsibilities pursuant to this chapter.
 - "(j) The chairman chair of the commission shall keep a true record of all of the proceedings of the meetings of the commission. At the call of any member, the vote on any pending question shall be taken by ayes and nays, and the same shall be entered in such the record, the. The record of the proceedings of the commission shall be open to any member of

the commission and to the public at all times and a. A copy of such the record, certified by the chairman chair, shall be competent evidence in all courts.

"(k) The commission shall decline to may not disclose the names and addresses of victims or claimants who have applied for compensation pursuant to this article or the facts or circumstances of the criminally injurious conduct perpetrated against them.

"(k) (1) All members and employees of the commission handling money or exercising authority over any property shall, before entering the discharge of their duties, shall give provide a bond with a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Alabama this state, as surety, payable to the commission in an amount or amounts sufficient to protect the commission against any loss with respect to the funds, money, or property handled, conditioned for the faithful discharge of their duties and responsibilities and further conditioned upon their faithfully accounting for all moneys monies, funds, or properties coming into their possession in the capacity of their employment.

"(1) (m) The Attorney General or the district attorney of the county wherein where the State Capitol is located shall, upon written request by the commission, shall represent the commission in all litigation to which where the commission is a party or in which the commission has an interest. The Attorney General shall serve as a legal advisor to the commission.

"(m) (n) All commission members shall be paid two
hundred fifty dollars (\$250) per day and mileage for
attendance of commission meetings. Mileage and per diem shall
be the same as allowed state employees when a commission
member is traveling on official business of the commission and
shall be paid from the Alabama Crime Victims Compensation

Fund.

"The commission shall have all the powers and privileges of a corporation and all of its business shall be transacted in the name of the commission. In addition to any other powers and duties specified elsewhere in this article, the commission shall have the power to may do any of the following:

- "(1) Regulate its own procedures except as otherwise provided in this chapter.
 - "(2) Define any term not defined in this article.
- "(3) Prescribe forms necessary to carry out the purposes of this article.
 - "(4) Obtain access to investigative reports made by law enforcement officers or law enforcement agencies which may be necessary to assist the commission in making a determination of eligibility for compensation under this article; provided, however, the reports and the information contained herein, when received by the commission, shall be confidential and under no circumstances shall may the commission disclose the same except to a grand jury.

"(5) Take judicial notice of general, technical, and 1 2 scientific facts within their specialized knowledge. "(6) Publicize the availability of compensation and 3 information regarding the filing of claims therefor. 4 5 "(7) Collect all moneys monies provided by this article to be collected by the commission. 6 7 "(8) Provide for and maintain all necessary administrative facilities and personnel. 8 9 "(9) Provide for payment of all administrative 10 salaries, fees, and expenses. "(10) Cause its moneys monies to be invested and its 11 investments sold or exchanged and the proceeds and income 12 13 collected. 14 "(11) Determine who is a victim or dependent. 15 "(12) Pass upon Consider all applications for 16 compensation or other benefits provided for in this article. 17 "(13) a. Authorize the executive director to pass 18 upon determine eligibility for all supplemental applications 19 for compensation in an amount not to exceed one thousand 20 dollars (\$1,000) and to pass upon all original applications 21 for claims in an amount not to exceed two thousand dollars 22 (\$2,000) and authorize payment for approved and reduced 23 claims. 24 "b. The commission shall review all contested cases 25 pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act. The commission may affirm, reverse, or modify the executive 26

director's claims decisions.

"(14) Adopt rules and regulations as may be

necessary or desirable to expedite the administration of the
affairs of the commission not inconsistent with this article.

- "(15) Provide descriptive literature and promotional items respecting the commission and its duties.
 - "(16) Pay all compensation or other benefits that may be determined to be due under this article and under the rules and regulations of the commission.
 - "(17) Employ such agents, attorneys, actuaries, and other specialized personnel as shall be necessary or desirable to enable as needed by the commission to carry on its functions in a proper and sound manner.
 - "(18) Receive by gift, grant, devise, or bequest any moneys monies or properties of any nature or description.
 - "(19) Accept and administer loans, grants, and donations from the federal government, its agencies, and all other sources, public and private, for carrying out any of its functions.
 - "(20) Develop a comprehensive analysis of the problems regarding victims of crime within the criminal justice system or systems of this state and formulate model programs, plans, or methods for lessening the physical, mental, or financial burdens placed on innocent crime victims by the operation of the criminal justice system both on the state and local level.
 - "(21) Identify laws, rules, or regulations proposed or adopted by any agency or institution of this state or any

political subdivision thereof which have or will have a significant adverse or beneficial impact upon crime victims and to advocate the adoption, repeal, or modification thereof in the interest of innocent victims of crime.

"(22) Collect, develop, and maintain statistical information, records, and reports as the commission may determine relevant or necessary to carry out its powers, duties, or functions pursuant to this article. All agencies and institutions of this state or the political subdivisions thereof shall, upon a written request by the commission, shall furnish to the commission statistical information or data as requested by the commission shall deem necessary to fulfill its duties and responsibilities.

"(23) Award loans or grants of money, equipment, or personnel to public or private nonprofit corporations or associations, agencies of the State of Alabama or political subdivisions thereof, or to state, county, or municipal law enforcement, prosecutorial, or judicial agencies upon terms and conditions as the commission may deem proper for the purpose of developing, enhancing, or establishing bona fide model crime victims service programs which emphasize the collection of restitution from criminals as an integral part of the criminal justice process, but the. The loans or grants shall only be awarded when sufficient funds are available in excess of reasonably anticipated or projected claims for compensation.

1	"(24) Provide for the cost of <u>forensic</u> medical
2	examinations for the purpose of gathering evidence and
3	treatment for preventing venereal disease sexually transmitted
4	infections in sexual abuse crimes and offenses.
5	"(25) Carry out any powers expressly granted
6	elsewhere in this article to the commission.
7	"(26) All other powers necessary for the proper
8	administration of this article."
9	Section 2. This act shall become effective
10	immediately following its passage and approval by the
11	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
