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2	<u>ENROLLED</u> , An Act,		
3	Relating to the Board of Nursing; to amend Section		
4	34-21-81, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the		
5	definition of advanced practice nursing by a Certified		
6	Registered Nurse Anesthetist; and to specify that a Certified		
7	Registered Nurse Anesthetist also practices in coordination		
8	with a licensed physician, podiatrist, or dentist.		
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
10	Section 1. Section 34-21-81, Code of Alabama 1975,		
11	is amended to read as follows:		
12	"§34-21-81.		
13	"As used in this article, the following terms shall		
14	have the following meanings:		
15	" <del>(3) <u>(</u>1)</del> ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSE. A registered nurse		
16	that who has gained additional knowledge and skills through		
17	successful completion of an organized program of nursing		
18	education that prepares nurses for advanced practice roles and		
19	has been certified by the Board of Nursing to engage in the		
20	practice of advanced practice nursing. There shall be four		
21	categories of advanced practice nurses: Certified registered		
22	nurse practitioners (CRNP), certified nurse midwives (CNM),		
23	certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNA), and clinical		
24	nurse specialists (CNS). Certified registered nurse		
25	practitioners and certified nurse midwives are subject to		

1 collaborative practice agreements with an Alabama physician. 2 Certified registered nurse anesthetists and clinical nurse specialists are not subject to collaborative practice 3 agreements with an Alabama physician and are not subject to 4 the requirements of Sections 34-21-82, 34-21-83, and 34-21-85 5 6 to 34-21-92, inclusive, and are prohibited from engaging in any of the acts or functions of a certified registered nurse 7 8 practitioner (CRNP) or a certified nurse midwife (CNM) as 9 established by this article and regulations adopted under this 10 article.

11 "(4)(2) ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSING. The delivery of 12 health care services by registered nurses who have gained 13 additional knowledge and skills through successful completion 14 of an organized program of nursing education that prepares 15 nurses for advanced practice roles as certified registered 16 nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, certified nurse 17 anesthetists, and clinical nurse specialists:

18 "(1)(3) BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS. The State Board
 19 of Medical Examiners established pursuant to Section 34-24-53.

20 "(2)(4) BOARD OF NURSING. The Board of Nursing
21 established under Section 34-21-2.

"a. Practice as a certified registered nurse
practitioner (CRNP) means the performance of nursing skills by
a registered nurse who has demonstrated by certification that
he or she has advanced knowledge and skills in the delivery of

nursing services within a health care system that provides for consultation, collaborative management, or referral as indicated by the health status of the client.

"b. Practice as a certified nurse midwife (CNM) 4 5 means the performance of nursing skills by a registered nurse 6 who has demonstrated by certification that he or she has advanced knowledge and skills relative to the management of 7 8 women's health care focusing on pregnancy, childbirth, the 9 postpartum period, care of the newborn, family planning, and 10 gynecological needs of women, within a health care system that 11 provides for consultation, collaborative management, or 12 referral as indicated by the health status of the client.

13 "c. Practice as a certified registered nurse 14 anesthetist (CRNA) means the performance of or the assistance 15 in any act involving the determination, preparation, 16 administration, procedural ordering, or monitoring of any drug 17 used to render an individual insensible to pain for surgical 18 and other therapeutic or diagnostic procedures. The nurse anesthetist is qualified in accordance with Section 27-46-3 19 20 and is licensed by the Board of Nursing and functions under 21 the direction of or in coordination with a physician licensed 22 to practice medicine, <u>a podiatrist</u>, or a dentist, who is 23 immediately available. Nothing in this paragraph shall be 24 construed to restrict the authority of a health care facility

1 <u>to adopt policies relating to the provision of anesthesia and</u> 2 analgesia services.

"d. Practice of clinical nurse specialist (CNS)
nursing means the performance of nursing skills by a
registered nurse who, through study and supervised practice at
the graduate level and as evidenced by certification, has
advanced knowledge and practice skills in a specialized area
of practice, except that a clinical nurse specialist may not
do any of the following:

10 "1. Perform delegated medical acts or engage in11 collaborative practice as described in this article.

12 "2. Perform any of the functions of a certified 13 registered nurse practitioner or a certified nurse midwife as 14 described in this article and the regulations adopted under 15 this article, whether or not performed within a collaborative 16 practice relationship.

17 "3. Prescribe drugs of any type. A clinical nurse
18 specialist may perform nursing services permitted under this
19 subdivision as an independent contractor.

"(5) COLLABORATION. A formal relationship between one or more certified registered nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives and a physician or physicians under which these nurses may engage in advanced practice nursing as evidenced by written protocols approved in accordance with the requirements of this article or exempted in accordance with

requirements of this article. The term collaboration does not require direct, on-site supervision of the activities of a certified registered nurse practitioner or a certified nurse midwife by the collaborating physician. The term does require such professional oversight and direction as may be required by the rules and regulations of the State Board of Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing.

8 "(6) COORDINATION WITH. When an anesthesiologist is 9 not physically present, the working relationship between a 10 physician, a podiatrist, or a dentist and a certified 11 registered nurse anesthetist licensed to practice in this 12 state. Each contributes his or her respective expertise in the 13 provision of patient care, which includes the discussion of 14 patient treatment, diagnosis, and consultation.

15 "(7) JOINT COMMITTEE OF THE STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL 16 EXAMINERS AND THE BOARD OF NURSING FOR ADVANCED PRACTICE 17 NURSES. The Joint Committee of the State Board of Medical 18 Examiners and the Board of Nursing for Advanced Practice 19 Nurses shall mean and shall be a committee composed of all of 20 the following:

21 "a. Two physicians licensed to practice medicine in22 the State of Alabama.

23 "b. One registered nurse licensed to practice24 professional nursing in the State of Alabama.

"c. One licensed physician engaged in a
 collaborative practice with a certified registered nurse
 practitioner or a certified nurse midwife in the State of
 Alabama.

5 "d. One certified registered nurse practitioner
6 engaged in advanced practice with a physician in the State of
7 Alabama.

8 "e. One certified nurse midwife engaged in advanced9 practice with a physician in the State of Alabama.

"(8) LEGEND DRUG. Any drug, medicine, chemical, or 10 11 poison bearing on the label the words, "Caution, Federal Law 12 prohibits dispensing without prescription" or similar words 13 indicating that such drug, medicine, chemical, or poison may 14 be sold or dispensed only upon the prescription of a licensed practitioner, except that the term legend drug shall not 15 16 include any drug, substance, or compound which is listed in 17 Schedules I through V of the Alabama Uniform Controlled 18 Substances Act.

19 "(6)(9) PHYSICIAN or COLLABORATING PHYSICIAN. A
20 doctor of medicine or a doctor of osteopathy licensed to
21 practice medicine in Alabama who agrees in writing to practice
22 in collaboration with one or more certified registered nurse
23 practitioners or certified nurse midwives in accordance with
24 the rules and regulations adopted by the State Board of
25 Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing.

1 "(9)(10) PRESCRIBE or PRESCRIBING. The act of 2 issuing a written prescription for a legend drug. 3 "(10)(11) PRESCRIPTION. An order for a legend drug which is written and signed by a practitioner authorized by 4 law to prescribe and administer such drugs and which is 5 6 intended to be filled, compounded, or dispensed by a 7 pharmacist. "(12) PROCEDURAL ORDERING. The ordering of the 8 9 anesthesia plan, including the ordering of medications and tests before, during, or after analgesia or anesthesia in 10 11 accordance with the anesthesia plan. 12 "(11)(13) PROTOCOL. A document approved in accordance with Section 34-21-87 establishing the permissible 13 14 functions and activities to be performed by certified 15 registered nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives 16 and signed by collaborating physicians and any nurse 17 practitioners or nurse midwives practicing with those 18 physicians." Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 19 20 first day of the third month following its passage and

21 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
