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ENROLLED, An Act,

Relating to municipalities, to amend Section 3 11-43-85, Code of Alabama 1975, and to create the Municipal 4 Audit Clarification Act, to require the mayor or city manager 5 6 of a municipality with certain annual expenditures to cause to be conducted an annual or biennial audit of the financial 7 8 affairs and transactions of the municipality and to make an annual or biennial report of the audit to the city council 9 10 upon completion of the report; and to permit the mayor or city 11 manager of a municipality with certain annual expenditures to 12 provide a report of agreed upon procedures in lieu of a biennial audit report. 13

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 11-43-85, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§11-43-85.

In cities and towns, the mayor, at least once a 18 19 year, shall appoint an independent public accountant or the 20 Department of Examiners of Public Accounts to conduct an 21 examination in accordance with generally accepted auditing 22 standards of all books and accounts of the city or town since 23 the preceding examination and to make a full report thereof in 24 writing, under oath, to be submitted to the council at its 25 first meeting after the completion of such report, and the

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1	same shall be spread upon the minutes of the council. For his
2	services said independent public accountant or the Department
3	of Examiners of Public Accounts shall be paid such sum as may
4	be agreed upon.
5	"(a) This act shall be known and may be cited as the
6	Municipal Audit Clarification Act.
7	"(b)(1) In a municipality with annual expenditures
8	of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) or more, the
9	mayor or city manager shall provide for and cause to be made
10	an annual audit of the financial affairs and transactions of
11	all funds and activities of the municipality by an independent
12	public accountant for each fiscal year of the municipality.
13	" <u>(2) Except as provided in subdivision (3), in a</u>
14	municipality with annual expenditures of less than three
15	hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000), the mayor or city manager
16	shall provide for and cause to be made a biennial audit of the
17	financial affairs and transactions of all funds and activities
18	of the municipality by an independent public accountant for
19	each fiscal year of the municipality. The audit conducted
20	pursuant to this subdivision shall include each fiscal year
21	since the preceding audit.
22	"(3) In a municipality with annual expenditures of
23	less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), the city
24	council may elect to provide for and direct the mayor or city
25	manager to cause to be made, in lieu of the biennial audit

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1	required under subdivision (b)(2), an annual report that
2	complies with procedures established by the Department of
3	Examiners of Public Accounts. The annual report shall be
4	provided to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts and
5	shall constitute an annual audit report. The report shall
6	include all of the following:
7	"a. Proof and reconciliation of cash.
8	"b. Confirmation of cash balances.
9	"c. A list of all bank balances.
10	"d. A statement of cash receipts and cash
11	disbursements.
12	"e. A statement of compliance with state law.
13	"f. A report of agreed upon procedures.
14	"g. A report of motor fuel excise taxes collected
15	and the distribution and use of those proceeds.
16	"(c) A municipal audit under this section shall be
17	conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing
18	standards in a format prescribed by the Department of
19	Examiners of Public Accounts.
20	"(d)(1) A municipal audit or annual report under
21	this section shall be provided to the Department of Examiners
22	of Public Accounts in accordance with Section 41-5A-12.1.
23	"(2) In addition to the requirements of subdivision
24	(1), a municipal audit report under subdivision(b)(3) shall be
25	submitted to the city council at its first meeting after

1	completion of the report and shall be spread upon the minutes
2	of the council."
3	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
4	first day of the third month following its passage and
5	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
