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ENROLLED, An Act,

To amend Section 16-23-3, Code of Alabama 1975, as 3 amended by Act 2021-111, 2021 Regular Session, and to add 4 Section 16-23-3.01 to the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to 5 6 provisional teaching certificates; to authorize the issuance of a professional educator certificate to qualified 7 individuals who have held an alternative certificate for one 8 year, instead of three years; and to authorize the issuance of 9 10 a professional educator certificate to a qualified individual 11 who completes an alternative teacher preparation program 12 offered by an approved alternative teacher education 13 preparation organization.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 16-23-3, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended by Act 2021-111, 2021 Regular Session, is amended to read as follows:

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"§16-23-3.

19 "(a) It is the intent of the Legislature that the 20 State of Alabama shall modify its policies relative to the 21 certification of teachers to permit an expanded alternative 22 certification program for prospective teachers for grades six 23 through 12. Further, it is the intent of the Legislature that 24 policies, rules, and regulations impacting alternative 25 teaching certificate and teacher preparation programs shall

1 create an equal opportunity for design, approval, delivery, 2 implementation, and continued review for accredited teacher 3 education programs at a traditional institution of higher education as are created for alternative teacher preparation 4 5 programs offered by approved alternative teacher education 6 preparation organizations. In addition to certificates issued 7 pursuant to this chapter to individuals graduating from 8 approved teacher education programs, the State Board of 9 Education shall adopt policies, procedures, rules, 10 regulations, or standards authorizing an alternative 11 certificate to be issued by the State Superintendent of 12 Education to an individual, regardless of whether the 13 individual is a graduate of an approved teacher education 14 program, where the applicant shall:

"(1) Hold an earned bachelor's or higher degree from
 a regionally accredited institution of higher education <u>which</u>
 <u>offers, at a minimum, junior and senior level courses of</u>
 <u>instruction</u>.

19 "(2) Submit the required application forms and fees 20 and, when required, a separate fingerprint fee, along with 21 fingerprints and release forms.

"(3) Be recommended for certification by the employing Alabama local school superintendent or private school administrator.

1	"(4) Be assigned a mentor by the employing
2	superintendent or private school administrator.
3	"(5) Meet the requirements of the Alabama
4	Prospective Teacher Testing Educator Certification Assessment
5	Program as set forth by the State Board of Education.
6	"(6) Verify compliance with one of the following
7	admission criteria:
8	"a. That at least 30 semester hours credit, 18 of
9	which shall be upper division level, have been earned in the
10	field for which certification is sought.
11	"b. An earned bachelor's or higher degree from a
12	regionally accredited institution of higher education with a
13	non-education major in the academic area for which
14	certification is sought.
15	"c. A passing score on the appropriate Praxis
16	content test of the Alabama Prospective Teacher Testing
17	Program.
18	" <del>(7) Request that an official transcript be sent</del>
19	directly to the employing superintendent or private school
20	administrator.
21	"d. Any other admission criteria established by the
22	State Board of Education.
23	"(b) The State Board of Education shall further
24	adopt policies, procedures, rules, regulations, or standards
25	authorizing an alternative certificate to be issued by the

1	State Superintendent of Education to an individual, regardless
2	of whether the individual is a graduate of an approved teacher
3	education program, where the applicant shall:
4	"(1) Hold a master's or higher degree from a
5	regionally accredited institution of higher education.
6	"(2) Be a retiree in good standing, or honorably
7	discharged former member of the Armed Forces of the United
8	States, with at least 10 years of service.
9	"(3) Otherwise satisfy all other requirements of
10	subsection (a), as they relate to a master's or higher degree,
11	except for the requirement that he or she verify a passing
12	score on the appropriate Praxis content test of the Alabama
13	Prospective Teacher Testing Program as provided in paragraph
14	c. of subdivision (6) of subsection (a).
15	"(c) Any alternative certificate shall be valid for
16	the period of time as shall be set by policies, procedures,
17	rules, regulations, or standards which shall be adopted by the
18	State Board of Education but in no event shall the period
19	extend beyond four years from the July 1 beginning date of the
20	initial alternative certificate.
21	"(d) Where an individual has received an alternative
22	certificate or certificates and has been employed for three
23	full years by no more than two county or city school boards or
24	<del>private schools</del> <u>one full year as an educator</u> while holding <u>one</u>
25	or more alternative certificates, the individual may be

granted a teaching certificate issued by the State
 Superintendent of Education pursuant to Section 16-23-1, when:

3 "(1) Approved by the State Superintendent of4 Education.

"(2) Approved according to policies, procedures, 5 6 rules, regulations, or standards which shall be adopted by the State Board of Education. The policies, procedures, rules, 7 8 regulations, or standards shall require that the recipient of an alternative certificate successfully complete no more than 9 10 the equivalent of 12 semester hours of college course work in 11 education related courses, as may be determined by the State Board of Education based upon factors such as the recipient's 12 individual educational background, prior to the issuance of a 13 14 teaching certificate pursuant to Section 16-23-1.

15 "(e) Any individual granted a teaching certificate 16 issued by the State Superintendent of Education pursuant to 17 Section 16-23-1, following the receipt of an alternative certificate, as herein provided, may be eligible to attain 18 continuing service status pursuant to Chapter 24C, the 19 Students First Act of 2011. Time served as a teacher pursuant 20 21 to an alternative certificate shall be counted in determining 22 continuing service status pursuant to Section 16-24C-4.

"(f) The State Superintendent of Education, in cases
 of emergency when certified teachers, including teachers who
 may have received alternative certificates pursuant to this

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1 section, are not available, may grant emergency certificates of the different kinds and grades, but any such emergency 2 certificate shall not be valid for a period to exceed two 3 years but shall expire at the end of the scholastic year for 4 5 which it is issued. An emergency certificate may be extended 6 or renewed one time as provided by policies, procedures, rules, regulations, or standards adopted by the State Board of 7 8 Education, for a maximum validity of four years. Time served as a teacher pursuant to an emergency certificate shall not be 9 counted in determining continuing service status pursuant to 10 11 Section 16-24C-4.

12 "(g) Any alternative certificate issued pursuant to 13 this section shall be limited to individuals teaching grades 14 six through 12; provided, however, that an alternative 15 certificate may be issued for individuals teaching grades 16 kindergarten through eight if limited to the subject areas of 17 the fine arts or foreign languages, or both."

Section 2. Section 16-23-3.01 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

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\$16-23-3.01.

(a) The State of Alabama shall modify its policies
relative to the certification of teachers to permit the
issuance of a professional educator certificate to those
qualified individuals who successfully complete an approved
alternative teacher education preparation organization. In

1 addition to any provisional certificates and professional 2 certificates issued pursuant to this chapter to individuals graduating from approved teacher education programs, the State 3 Board of Education shall authorize the issuance of a 4 5 professional educator certificate by the State Superintendent 6 of Education to a qualified individual who completes an 7 approved alternative teacher education preparation 8 organization.

(b) The State Superintendent of Education shall 9 10 maintain a database of alternative teacher education 11 preparation organizations, approved by the State Board of 12 Education, as a means for screening, recruiting, and 13 recommending for certification gualified individuals to teach 14 in the public K-12 schools. An approved alternative teacher 15 education preparation organization, at a minimum, shall 16 require each applicant whom the approved organization 17 recommends for initial licensure to satisfy all of the 18 following:

19 (1) Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited
20 institution of higher education <u>which offers</u>, at a minimum,
21 junior and senior level courses of instruction.

(2) Successfully pass a criminal history backgroundinformation check.

24 (3) Successfully complete an alternative teacher25 preparation program offered by the approved organization.

1	(c) In determining which alternative teacher
2	education preparation organizations to approve, the State
3	Board of Education, may consider prerequisites including, but
4	not limited to, the following:
5	(1) Successful operation in at least five states.
6	(2) Successful operation of an alternative teacher
7	preparation program for at least 10 years.
8	(3) Requirement that an applicant pass a subject
9	area examination or professional teaching examination, or
10	both.
11	(d) An individual who is granted a professional
12	educator certificate pursuant to this section may teach in the
13	subject areas and at the educational levels he or she has
14	successfully completed through the alternative teacher
15	preparation program offered by the approved alternative
16	teacher education preparation organization.
17	(e) An individual who holds a professional educator
18	certificate pursuant to this section may apply for a
19	professional renewal license and shall in all other respects
20	be treated in the same manner as an individual who holds a
21	professional educator certificate granted upon successful
22	completion of traditional, in-state teaching certification
23	programs.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
