11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
12	Section 1. The following amendment to the
13	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become
14	valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of
15	this act are fulfilled:
16	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
17	(a) All vacancies in the office of judge of the
18	circuit court and the office of judge of the district court of
19	Mobile County which shall occur subsequent to January 15,
20	2023, shall be filled in the manner and for the time provided
21	by this amendment.
22	(b)(1) The Mobile County Judicial Commission is
23	hereby created for the purpose of nominating to the Governor
24	persons for appointment to a vacancy. The members of the
25	commission shall be all of the following:

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1		ć	a.	Two	individuals	who	are	members	of	the	Alabama
2	State F	Bar.									

b. Two individuals who are not members of theAlabama State Bar.

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- c. One judge of the circuit court of Mobile County.
- (2) All members of the commission must reside in the territorial jurisdiction of the circuit court of Mobile County.
- (c) (1) a. The two members of the commission who are required to be members of the Alabama State Bar shall be elected by the members of the bar who are regularly licensed and qualified to practice law in this state and who reside in the territorial jurisdiction of the circuit court of Mobile County.
- b. The executive committee of the Mobile County Bar Association, or its successor body in that capacity, shall adopt policies and procedures consistent with this amendment for the election of the members of the commission that are required to be members of the Alabama State Bar.
- c. The executive committee shall certify in writing to the judge of probate of Mobile County the names of the persons elected as members of the commission by the members of the bar.
- (2) The members of the Legislature from Mobile

 County shall elect the two members of the commission who are

required not to be members of the Alabama State Bar. The senators and representatives shall certify in writing to the judge of probate the names of the persons elected by them as members.

- (3) The judges of the circuit court of Mobile County shall elect the member of the commission who is required to be a judge of the circuit court. The judges of the circuit court shall certify in writing to the judge of probate the name of the circuit judge elected by the circuit judges as member. The judge member shall serve as chair of the commission.
- (4) The judge of probate of Mobile County shall record all the certificates of election and shall safely and permanently keep the original certificates. Upon receipt and recordation of every certificate, he or she shall send to the Governor a certified copy of every certificate.
- (d)a. The terms of office of all members of the commission shall be six years, except that the initial terms of office of the two members of the state bar first elected shall be for one and two years respectively, and of the two members first elected by the senators and representatives in the Legislature from Mobile County shall be for three and four years respectively, and the term of the circuit judge elected by the circuit judges shall be for five years; the length of the terms of office of the members of the commission being indicated by the respective electing bodies.

- (e) No member of the commission, having served a full term, shall be eligible to succeed himself or herself as member. No member of the commission shall be eligible for nomination to the Governor for appointment as judge of the circuit court or district court during the term of office for which the member has been selected to serve.
- any salary or other compensation for their services as members. No member of the commission other than the member required to be a judge of the circuit court shall hold any public office, and no member of the commission shall hold any official position in any political party.
- (g) (1) If, subsequent to January 15, 2023, a vacancy occurs or, in the opinion of the chair of the commission, a vacancy is likely to occur in the office of judge of the circuit court or in the office of judge of the district court of Mobile County, the commission shall nominate to the Governor three persons having the qualifications for that office.
- (2) The nomination shall be made only by the concurrence of a majority of the members of the commission.

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- (4) Any vacancy occurring in the office of judge of the circuit or district court of Mobile County, which is required to be filled by appointment on nominations made by a judicial commission, shall be made within 90 days from the date of the submission of the nominations.
- (5) In the event the Governor fails to fill the vacancy from the nominations within the 90-day period provided in subdivision (4), the appointment shall be made by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Alabama.
- (6) The commission shall establish procedures consistent with this amendment for nominating candidates to the Governor.
 - (h) This amendment shall be self-executing.

Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment and contingent upon the ratification of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, the Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as appropriate in the constitution based upon a logical sequence and the particular subject or topic of the amendment. In this amendment, the Code Commissioner may change capitalization, spelling, and punctuation for the purpose of style and uniformity; correct manifest grammatical, clerical, and typographical errors; and correct incorrect

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1	cross-references. When publishing the Constitution of Alabama
2	of 2022, as amended, the Code Commissioner may omit this
3	instructional paragraph.
4	Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
5	shall be held in accordance with Section 284.01 of the
6	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section
7	284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
8	Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this
9	state.
10	Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
11	assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
12	amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
13	following description of the substance or subject matter of
14	the proposed constitutional amendment:
15	"Relating to Mobile County; proposing an amendment
16	to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to provide
17	for a judicial nominating commission in Mobile County, to
18	provide for the composition, duties, and powers of the
19	commission; and to provide that this amendment be
20	self-executing.
