| 9 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: |
| 10 | Section 1. Sections 16-28-40, 32-6-4, <u>32-6-6,</u> |
| 11 | 32-6-6.1, 32-6-15, and 32-6-21, Code of Alabama 1975, are |
| 12 | amended to read as follows: |
| 13 | "§16-28-40. |
| 14 | "(a) The Department of Public Safety shall deny a |
| 15 | driver's license or a learner's license for the operation of a |
| 16 | motor vehicle to any person under the age of 19 who does not, |
| 17 | at the time of application, present a diploma or other |
| 18 | certificate of graduation issued to the person from a |
| 19 | secondary high school of this state or any other state, or |
| 20 | documentation that the person satisfies one of the following: |
| 21 | "(1) is <u>The person is</u> enrolled and making |
| 22 | satisfactory progress in a course leading to a general |
| 23 | educational development certificate (GED) from a state |
| 24 | approved institution or organization, or has obtained the |
| 25 | certificate ; |
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| 1 | "(2) is <u>The person is</u> enrolled in a secondary school |
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| 2 | of this state or any other state and has not at the time of |
| 3 | application accumulated disciplinary points while a student in |
| 4 | school that would extend the age of eligibility for the |
| 5 | student to apply for a driver's license ; . |
| 6 | "(3) is <u>The person is</u> participating in a job |
| 7 | training program approved by the State Superintendent of |
| 8 | Education; |
| 9 | "(4) is <u>The person is</u> gainfully and substantially |
| 10 | employed ; |
| 11 | "(5) $\frac{1}{100}$ The person is a parent with the care and |
| 12 | custody of a minor or unborn child ; . |
| 13 | "(6) has a <u>A</u> physician certify <u>certifies</u> that the |
| 14 | parents of the person depend on him or her as their sole |
| 15 | source of transportation; or. |
| 16 | "(7) is <u>The person is</u> exempted from this requirement |
| 17 | due to circumstances beyond his or her control as provided in |
| 18 | this chapter. |
| 19 | "(b) (1) The attendance officer or chief attendance |
| 20 | administrator, upon request, shall provide documentation of |
| 21 | enrollment status and disciplinary points on a form approved |
| 22 | by the Department of Education to any student 15 years of age |
| 23 | or older who is properly enrolled in a school under the |
| 24 | jurisdiction of the official, for presentation to the |
| 25 | Department of Public Safety, on application for, or renewal or |
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reinstatement of, a driver's license or a learner's license to
operate a motor vehicle.

"(2) Upon the request of a student seeking a fee 3 exemption on the basis of his or her homelessness, the 4 5 attendance officer or chief attendance administrator staff 6 member designated to act as the local educational agency liaison for homeless children and youth, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. 7 § 11432(g)(1)(J)(ii), shall provide documentation that the 8 9 student is a qualified student, on a form approved by the Department of Education, for presentation to the Department of 10 11 Public Safety, on application for, or renewal, reinstatement, or replacement of a driver's license. The term "qualified 12 13 student" refers to a student who a school attendance officer 14 or chief attendance administrator the local educational agency liaison for homeless children and youth verifies as meeting 15 16 the definition of a "homeless child or youth" as provided by 17 42 U.S.C. § 11434(a)(2) and whose enrollment status and 18 disciplinary points have been documented pursuant to 19 subdivision (1).

"<u>(3)</u> Whenever a student 16 years of age or older withdraws from school, the attendance officer or chief attendance administrator shall notify the Department of Public Safety of the withdrawal. Withdrawal shall be defined as more than 10 consecutive or 15 days total unexcused absences during a single semester. "(c) Within five days of receipt of a notice of withdrawal, the Department of Public Safety shall send notice to the licensee that his or her driver's license or learner's license will be suspended under this article on the 30th day following the date the notice was sent unless documentation of compliance with this article is received by the department before the 30th day.

"(d) Whenever the withdrawal from school of the 8 9 student, or the failure of the student to enroll in a course 10 leading to or to obtain a GED or high school diploma, is 11 beyond the control of the student, or is for the purpose of 12 transfer to another school as confirmed in writing by the 13 parent or guardian of the student, or is for the purpose of 14 participating in a job training program approved by the State 15 Superintendent of Education, no notice shall be sent by the 16 proper school official to the Department of Public Safety to 17 suspend the license of the student. If the student is applying 18 for or renewing a driver's license or a learner's license, the 19 attendance officer or chief attendance administrator, upon 20 request, shall provide the student with documentation to 21 present to the Department of Public Safety to exempt the 22 student from this section. The local superintendent of 23 education with the assistance of the county or city school 24 attendance director as the case may be, and any other staff or 25 school personnel, or the appropriate school official of any

private secondary school, shall be the sole judge of whether the withdrawal is due to circumstances beyond the control of the person. Suspension or expulsion from school or imprisonment in a jail or penitentiary is not a circumstance beyond the control of a person.

6 "(e)(1) Any person over the age of 14 who is convicted of the crime of possession of a pistol on the 7 premises of a public school, or a public school bus, or both, 8 under Section 13A-11-72 shall be denied issuance of a driver's 9 10 permit or license for the operation of a motor vehicle for 180 11 days from the date the person is eligible and applies for a permit or license for the operation of a motor vehicle. Any 12 13 adjudication as a juvenile delinquent or youthful offender 14 where the underlying charge is the possession of a pistol on 15 the premises of a public school, or a public school bus, or 16 both, under Section 13A-11-72 shall be considered a conviction 17 under this subsection, and the adjudication of a person as a juvenile delinquent or youthful offender where the underlying 18 charge is a violation under Section 13A-11-72 shall be 19 reported to the Department of Public Safety. 20

"(2) If a person over the age of 14 years possesses a driver's license on the date of conviction, the Department of Public Safety, within five days of receipt of a notice of conviction from the court, shall send notice to the licensee that his or her driver's license will be suspended. The notice

shall state that the license will be suspended for 180 days commencing on the 30th day following the date the notice was sent unless documentation is received by the department before the 30th day that the person was not convicted of the crime. Upon the appropriate date, the department shall suspend the license.

"(3) Upon the written request of the person whose 7 8 license is denied or suspended, the Department of Public 9 Safety shall afford the person an opportunity for a hearing in 10 the same manner and under the procedure used for other 11 driver's license suspensions. If the suspension or denial of issuance determination is sustained by the Director of the 12 13 Department of Public Safety or the authorized agent of the 14 director, upon such hearing, the person may file a petition in 15 the appropriate court to review the final order of suspension 16 or denial by the director or the authorized agent of the 17 director in the same manner and under the same conditions as is provided in the case of suspensions and denials. 18

"(4) If the conviction is reversed within the 180-day period, the department, upon receipt of notice of the reversal from the Administrative Office of Courts, shall reinstate a suspended license and shall accept an application for a license and shall issue the license according to law and regulation.

1 "(5) The court shall notify the Department of Public 2 Safety of the conviction of a person over the age of 14 of a crime involving the possession of a pistol on the premises of 3 a public school, or a public school bus, or both, under 4 Section 13A-11-72 and any reversal of the conviction. The 5 6 Administrative Office of Courts may promulgate necessary rules 7 and regulations to implement this notification procedure. "§32-6-4. 8 "(a) Upon the installation of a system for the 9 issuance of drivers' licenses and nondriver identification 10 11 cards with color photographs of licensees and nondrivers thereon, all initial Alabama licenses and nondriver 12 13 identification cards and renewals of licenses issued in this 14 state shall be issued in the following manner: 15 "(1) The person shall apply under oath to the 16 Department of Public Safety, Driver License Division, for an 17 initial Alabama driver's license or nondriver identification card and to the judge of probate or license commissioner of 18 19 the county of his or her residence for the renewal of a license or nondriver identification card upon a form which 20 21 shall be provided by the Director of Public Safety.

"(2) For the renewal of a driver's license or nondriver identification card, the judge of probate or license commissioner shall take a color photograph of the licensee

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with equipment to be furnished by the Department of Public
 Safety to be attached to each application.

"(b)(1) For the purpose of defraying the cost of 3 issuing drivers' licenses or nondriver identification cards 4 5 with color photographs of the licensee or nondriver thereon, 6 except as provided in Section 32-6-4.1, the Department of Public Safety, Driver License Division, judge of probate, or 7 license commissioner shall collect for each license or 8 9 identification card the sum of twenty dollars (\$20) required 10 fee for a four-year license or an identification card, and the 11 Department of Public Safety, Driver License Division, judge of probate, or license commissioner shall give the licensee a 12 13 driver's license or identification card. Except as provided by 14 rules and regulations of the Director of Public Safety, the 15 nondriver identification card shall bear no expiration date 16 for any person 62 years of age or older.

17 "(2) A qualified student, as defined in Section 18 16-28-40(b)(2), is exempt from the driver's license issuance 19 fee required by this section.

"(c) (1) Any male applicant who applies for a driver's license or a learner's license or a renewal of the license who is at least 18 years of age, but less than 26 years of age, shall be registered in compliance with the requirements of Section 3 of the Military Selective Service Act, 50 App. U.S.C.A. Sec. 453, as amended.

1 "(2) The Department of Public Safety shall forward 2 in an electronic format the necessary personal information of 3 the applicants identified in this subsection to the Selective Service System. The applicant's signature on the application 4 5 shall serve as an indication that the applicant either has 6 already registered with the Selective Service System or that he is authorizing the department to forward to the Selective 7 8 Service System the necessary information for registration. The 9 department shall notify the applicant at the time of 10 application that his signature constitutes consent to 11 registration with the Selective Service System, if he is not 12 already registered. 13 "§32-6-6.

14 "(a) Each driver's license issued by the Department 15 of Public Safety, except temporary permits or other special 16 circumstances as determined by the Director of the Department 17 of Public Safety, shall bear thereon contain a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee and a color photograph of the 18 licensee, the name, birthdate, address, and a description of 19 20 the licensee, who, for the purpose of identification and as a 21 condition precedent to the validity of the license, 22 immediately upon receipt thereof of the license, shall endorse 23 his or her usual or regular signature upon the license in the 24 space provided thereon, unless a facsimile of the licensee's 25 signature appears thereon on the license.

| 1 | "(b) A photo driver's license and photo nondriver |
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| 2 | identification card as provided in Section 32-6-4 shall have a |
| 3 | photo core that meets the minimum width and length dimensions |
| 4 | specified in ANSI standards X4.13-1971 and ANSI standard CR80, |
| 5 | plus or minus 1/4 inch. In addition to all current and |
| 6 | existing fees, the department may charge an additional fee to |
| 7 | recover the cost of producing and issuing photo drivers' |
| 8 | driver's licenses and photo nondriver identification cards. |

| 19 | and any excess shall revert to the General Fund at the end of |
| 20 | each fiscal year. |
| 21 | "§32-6-6.1. |
| 22 | "In addition to any other fees imposed for issuance |
| 23 | of a driver's license and photo nondriver identification card, |
| 24 | the Department of Public Safety shall impose an additional fee |
| 25 | of fifty cents (\$.50) for each driver's license and photo |
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nondriver identification card issued, except for a driver's 1 2 license issued to a qualifying student, as defined in Section 16-28-40(b)(2). The fee collected under this section shall be 3 allocated and appropriated to the Alabama Veterans Living 4 5 Legacy Trust Fund created by the Alabama Veterans Living 6 Legacy Act of 2008, Division 2, commencing with Section 16-44A-50, of Article 2 of Chapter 44A, and expenditures of 7 8 such the fee pursuant to the master plan for facilities, programs, and outreach provided by that division and its 9 10 related programs.

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"§32-6-15.

12 "(a) In the event any driver's license issued under 13 the provisions of this article is lost or destroyed, the 14 person to whom the same was issued may upon payment of a fee 15 of fifteen dollars (\$15) collection of the required fee and upon furnishing proof to the Director of Public Safety that 16 17 the same has been lost or destroyed, secure a duplicate. No fee shall be charged to a qualified student, as defined by 18 Section 16-28-40(b)(2), for his or her first duplicate 19 20 driver's license. The second and subsequent duplicates applied 21 for will shall require the payment of a fee of fifteen dollars 22 (\$15) and, upon furnishing proof to the Director of Public 23 Safety that his or her previously held license or duplicate 24 has been lost or destroyed, secure another duplicate. 25 Application for such a duplicate will shall be made to the

Director of Public Safety on forms provided by him the
 <u>director</u>. The fee shall be collected by the director, paid
 into the State Treasury, and credited to the Highway Traffic
 Safety Fund for the Department of Public Safety.

5 "(b) Any person making a false affidavit to the 6 Director of Public Safety for the purpose of obtaining a 7 duplicate driver's license shall be guilty of a misdemeanor 8 and upon conviction shall be punished by imprisonment in the 9 county jail for not more than 30 days or by a fine of not less 10 than twenty-five dollars (\$25) nor more than one hundred 11 dollars (\$100).

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"§32-6-21.

13 "(a) Every applicant for an original driver license, 14 temporary instruction and learner's permit, and motor driven 15 cycle operator's license, shall pay an examination fee of five 16 dollars (\$5) to the Alabama Department of Public Safety upon 17 applying to the officer, state trooper, or duly authorized agent of the Director of Public Safety, or to one of them 18 19 where there is more than one designated by the Director of 20 Public Safety. The five dollars dollar (\$5) fee shall be 21 required prior to each examination. No driver's license examination fee shall be charged to a qualified student, as 22 23 defined in Section 16-28-40(b)(2), for his or her first 24 examination.

"(b) The Alabama Department of Public Safety shall
issue proper receipts for the examination fee and shall
properly transmit all moneys monies received by it the
<u>department</u> for deposit in the State General Fund."
Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
