19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. (a) The Department of Labor shall
21	establish the Alabama Job Creation Ombudsman within the
22	Department of Labor to assist businesses with fewer than five
23	employees in completing the process of lawfully hiring
24	employees.
25	(b) The Alabama Job Creation Ombudsman shall do all
26	of the following:

1 (1) Complete and keep an updated detailed outline 2 and checklist of the process for hiring a new employee.

- (2) Create a repository from which prospective employers can download all state and federal forms necessary to lawfully hire a new employee.
  - (3) Maintain a website that provides a downloadable version of the detailed outline and checklist required under subdivision (1) and external links to state and federal agency websites involved in the hiring process.
  - (4) Provide phone and web based assistance to employers with fewer than five employees in communicating with federal, state, county and municipal government agencies, or quasi-governmental corporations or authorities as necessary during the hiring process.
  - (c) An employer with fewer than five employees that has completed the steps provided by the ombudsman as required in subsection (b) shall be immune from all criminal and civil liability provided by law relating to any deficiencies in the hiring process.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
