This bill would extend tuition reimbursement 11 12 for dually or concurrently enrolled high school and 13 college students. 14 This bill would set the cap for private 15 college tuition reimbursement at the rate of the 16 public institution with the highest tuition and 17 instructional fee rates. 18 This bill would also clarify that the 19 Alabama National Guard Education Assistance Program 20 may only pay for the first degree obtained and that 21 short certificates, long certificates, and 22 associate degrees are considered stackable 23 undergraduate credentials which may be used to 24 obtain a baccalaureate degree, with the first 25 degree obtained being considered a baccalaureate 26 degree. 27

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Sections 31-10-2, 31-10-3, and 31-10-4.1
17	of the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
18	"§31-10-2.
19	"The following words used in this article shall have
20	the <u>following</u> meanings as set forth by this section :
21	" (1)<u>(</u>2) ALABAMA NATIONAL GUARD. Federally recognized
22	units of the Alabama National Guard.
23	" (2) (1) ACTIVE MEMBER. A member of a federally
24	recognized unit of the Alabama National Guard meeting the
25	minimum requirements for satisfactory membership as defined in
26	the Department of the Army and Department of the Air Force
27	regulations.

1	"(3) TUITION. The per semester cost of instruction
2	and <u>mandatory instructional</u> fees to the student not to exceed
3	the average cost of tuition per semester of a state-supported
4	Alabama four year institution, as reported to the Alabama
5	Commission on Higher Education by state-supported institutions
6	of higher education and appearing on the tuition plus required
7	fees report of the commission, for classes or courses that
8	count towards the individual's degree or certificate plan as
9	designed and approved by the college or institution attended
10	for the individual's declared program of study. <u>Payments for</u>
11	students attending private institutions of higher education
12	shall not exceed the rates of the state-supported public
13	institution with the highest tuition and instructional fee
14	rates. Differential tuition or instructional fees that are
15	specific to any major are not included.

17	"Subject to the annual appropriation to the Alabama
18	National Guard Educational Assistance Program in the annual
19	Education Trust Fund Appropriation Act, provided such the
20	annual appropriations shall not exceed \$10,000,000 <u>ten million</u>
21	dollars (\$10,000,000), the Alabama Commission on Higher
22	Education is hereby authorized to may pay or reimburse the
23	qualifying tuition for any active member of the Alabama
24	National Guard who is <u>a student dually or concurrently</u>

25 <u>enrolled in high school and college or is</u> enrolled in a 26 program leading to the <u>a short certificate or long</u>

27 <u>certificate, or</u> associate, baccalaureate, masters, or

doctorate degree in an accredited institution of higher 1 2 learning, community or technical college within the State of Alabama. Such The payments or reimbursements shall be made 3 timely at the end of each academic quarter or semester for all 4 5 tuition reimbursements, and shall be made on the basis of certified invoices submitted by such the institution or school 6 7 to the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, and shall be supported by names of the students receiving such benefits, 8 together with the amounts claimed for each student. To be 9 10 eligible for such benefits, the individual, at the time of his or her enrollment must be an active member of the Alabama 11 12 National Guard in good standing and an active member of a 13 federally recognized unit of the Alabama National Guard. The member must be at least 17 years of age and must be a resident 14 15 of the State of Alabama. The tuition reimbursement authorized under this article may be used for undergraduate or graduate 16 17 studies. In no event will any individual be eligible to 18 receive more than 100 percent of qualified tuition when combined with similar federal veterans' educational benefits 19 20 available to members of the National Guard. All applicants for 21 tuition reimbursement shall complete a Free Application for 22 Student Financial Aid (FAFSA). In no event shall payments under the Alabama National Guard Educational Assistance 23 24 Program amount to more than 100 percent of qualified tuition 25 and fees. No person individual shall be eligible for tuition reimbursement for more than 12 years after the date of the 26 27 first tuition payment to him or her under this article. For

degrees above the baccalaureate, only 10 percent of the total 1 2 funds of the benefit program are to be utilized. The Alabama Commission on Higher Education shall set up minimum standards 3 for performance that must be met in order to maintain 4 5 eligibility for the continuation of the receipt of tuition reimbursements under this article that will ensure a member 6 will maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average. 7 In the event that requests for tuition reimbursements provided 8 9 for in this chapter article from the institutions for 10 educational benefits in any fiscal year exceed the appropriated amount, then the reimbursements will shall be 11 12 prorated equally among the institutions on a percentage basis 13 of the total invoices received by ACHE the Alabama Commission 14 on Higher Education and paid accordingly. Such The 15 reimbursement shall be made promptly at the end of each academic quarter or semester for all certified invoices. 16

18 "(a) Beginning October 1, 2016, any member of the 19 Alabama National Guard enrolled in a program leading to a 20 certificate, or an associate or bachelor's degree at an 21 accredited public institution of higher education, technical 22 college, or community college within the State of Alabama may 23 apply for a tuition reimbursement benefit as provided for in 24 this section if the applicant under this chapter article meets 25 the following requirements:

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"(1) The individual is 17 years of age or over.

"(2) The individual is a member of the Alabama 1 2 National Guard in good standing throughout the period or semester for which that individual receives education benefits 3 as indicated by continued satisfactory participation in the 4 5 Alabama National Guard as required by all applicable laws and regulations of the Department of the Army, the Department of 6 7 the Air Force, and the Alabama National Guard, and there is no unfavorable administrative action pending against him or her. 8

9 "(3) The individual completes a Free Application for
 10 Student Financial Aid, except for students dually or
 11 concurrently enrolled in high school and college.

"(b) Any member of the Alabama National Guard 12 13 receiving educational benefits under this section and the educational institutions they attend must shall comply with 14 15 the standards of Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) as required for Title IV benefits under the Higher Education Act 16 17 and as defined by that education institution provided the 18 member must shall maintain at least a cumulative 2.0 grade point average, or the letter equivalent. Those students who 19 20 would no longer be eligible to receive Title IV benefits due 21 to a failure to meet SAP standards shall no longer be eligible to receive benefits under this section. 22

"(c) To the extent permitted by law, prior to
applying any benefits provided for under this section,
institutional certifying officials and financial aid officials
shall first apply other federal, state, institutional, and
third party scholarships and grants awarded to the member for

1 that academic period for payment of required educational 2 expenses during an academic period, but only for classes or courses that count towards the individual's degree or 3 certificate plan as designed and approved by the college or 4 5 institution attended for the individual's declared program of study the benefits provided for under this section shall be 6 7 applied in a manner to maximize all of the member's educational assistance benefits. 8

9 "(d) No public institution of higher education in 10 this state shall impose a nonresident tuition rate or 11 differential out-of-state resident fee on an Alabama National 12 Guard member in good standing and who meets the requirements 13 of subsection (a).

14 "(e) All requirements under subsections (a) and (b) 15 shall be met as a condition of obtaining any education 16 assistance benefits under this chapter <u>article</u> and continued 17 eligibility for this exemption.

18 "(f) The Alabama Commission on Higher Education 19 shall be responsible for administering the overall policies, 20 guidance, implementation, and proper utilization of the 21 scholarship under this section.

"(g) The tuition scholarship under this chapter
article shall be claimed for no more than a total of 120
academic hours or until the receipt of the first degree for
which the scholarship is used, whichever comes first. The
tuition benefits provided by this article shall only pay for
the first degree obtained after approval for benefits under

1 this article. For the purposes of this article, short 2 certificates, long certificates, and associate degrees are 3 considered stackable undergraduate credentials which may be 4 used to obtain a baccalaureate degree; with the first degree 5 obtained while enrolled in a short certificate or long 6 certificate program being considered a baccalaureate degree.

7 "(h) Any member of the Alabama National Guard who 8 fails to remain in good standing or is terminated from further 9 service in the Alabama National Guard shall no longer be 10 eligible for exemption benefits under this section and any 11 benefits received by the member for the period, semester, or 12 term in which he or she becomes ineligible shall be repaid by 13 the member to the exempting institution.

14 "(i) Any member who is expelled or dismissed by an 15 institution of higher learning that provides scholarship 16 benefits under this section to that member shall no longer be 17 eligible for scholarship benefits under this section and shall 18 repay all benefits received under this section to the 19 institution.

20 "(j) Any member who is disqualified from serving in 21 the Alabama National Guard due solely to medical reasons, with 22 <u>a Veterans Administration disability rating of 40 percent or</u> 23 <u>greater</u>, shall be exempt from repaying any benefits received 24 under this section.

25 "(k) Any participating member of the Alabama
 26 National Guard Educational Assistance Program shall sign a
 27 promissory note or similar document with provisions for the

1	collection and repayment of benefits in the event that the
2	member is disqualified or otherwise becomes ineligible to
3	continue to receive benefits pursuant to this section."
4	Section 2. Specifically Article 2, commencing with
5	Section 31-10-20, of Chapter 10, Title 31, Code of Alabama
6	1975, relating to supplemental educational assistance benefits
7	for qualified active members of the National Guard, is
8	repealed.
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9 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 10 last day of the month of its passage and approval by the 11 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
