Relating to the Board of Optometric Scholarship

Awards; to amend Sections 34-22-60, 34-22-61, 34-22-62,

34-22-63, 34-22-64, and 34-22-65, Code of Alabama 1975; to

allow the board to conduct meetings remotely; to expand the

scholarship program to include loans to further optometric

training and to incentivize students to serve in underserved

areas of the state; to require the board to periodically

calculate and report the Optometric Shortage Index; to require

the board to establish and operate the Alabama Optometric

Service Program; to facilitate the repayment of loans issued

pursuant to this section; to expand remedies in the event of a

breach of loan repayment obligations; and to provide for

repayment of loans through approved service.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 34-22-60, 34-22-61, 34-22-62, 34-22-63, 34-22-64, and 34-22-65, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

"\$34-22-60.

"(a) (1) There is established the Board of Optometric Scholarship and Loan Awards which shall establish and award scholarships for academic excellence to provide for and further optometric training in pursuance of an optometric

- "(2) Awards may be available to qualified applicants for admission to the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry. Qualified applicants from any other optometric school accredited by the Accreditation Council on Optometric Education of the American Optometric Association are eligible to apply for loans provided through the Alabama Optometric Service Program, created pursuant to Section 34-22-61. The board shall give first priority to students who will attend the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry.
- "(b) The Board of Optometric Scholarship Awards board shall be composed of all of the following members:
- "(1) One optometrist from six components of the <u>nine</u> component societies of <u>the</u> Alabama Optometric Association whose terms of office shall be staggered, two optometrists being elected for a term of two years; two optometrists being elected for a term of three years; and two optometrists being elected for a term of four years, with each successor being elected for a term of four years.
- "(2) The secretary A member of the Alabama

  Optometric Association, or his or her designee, who shall serve as chair of the board appointed by the board of the Alabama

  Optometric Association.

15	"(d) Annually, the board shall elect a chair from

17	"(e) Fifty percent of the members of the board shall
18	constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at
19	meetings.
20	"(f) Members of the board may participate in a
21	meeting of the board by means of telephone conference, video
22	conference, or similar communications equipment by means of
23	which all persons participating in the meeting may hear each
24	other at the same time. Participation by such means shall

1	constitute presence in person at a meeting for all purposes,

4	"(a) The Board of Optometric Scholarship and Loan
5	Awards shall have power and authority to may make reasonable
6	rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of this
7	state, as may be necessary for the regulation of its
8	proceedings and for the discharge of the duties imposed upon
9	it the board.
10	"(b) The board shall receive and review all
11	applications for <del>scholarship</del> <u>scholarships</u> and loans <del>and</del>
12	awards; shall make a careful and thorough investigation of

December, the board shall submit a report on the condition,

1	performance, and accomplishments of the scholarships granted
2	and loans issued to all the following:
3	"a. The Governor.

6	"d. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
7	"e. The Chair of the House of Representatives Health

17	"(2) The board shall work with the Alabama

"The Board of Optometric Scholarship <u>and Loan</u> Awards shall establish two <u>the following</u> types of scholarships <del>as</del> follows <u>and loans</u>:

- "(1) A number of Annual loans, not exceeding 25 percent of the number of students enrolled in the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry, based on the economic need and scholastic ability of the applicant, in an amount not to exceed 30 percent of the current annual cost of tuition at the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry, shall. The loan shall be available to any bona fide resident of Alabama resident of good character who has been accepted for matriculation by the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry. This subdivision shall also apply to graduate students in vision science, at the discretion of the board.
- "(2) A number of nonrefundable merit scholarship awards Merit scholarships, not exceeding 25 percent of the number of students enrolled in the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry, in an amount not to exceed the current annual cost of tuition at the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry, shall. These scholarships shall be available to outstanding students, who are bona fide residents of Alabama, one-fourth. One-fourth of which the merit scholarships shall be awarded each year to members of the entering class at the University of Alabama at Birmingham

School of Optometry, who, in the judgment of the board, have
the highest scholastic achievement in undergraduate studies,
sufficient aptitude, excellence of character, and other
pertinent qualifications. Recipients of merit scholarships may
also apply for loans awarded by the board. This subdivision
shall also apply to graduate students in vision science, at
the discretion of the board.

"(3) Loans issued pursuant to the Alabama Optometric
Service Program. The board shall establish and operate the
Alabama Optometric Service Program, under which loans may be
issued by the board to applicants of good character who are
enrolled in the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of
Optometry, or any other educational institution accredited by
the Accreditation Council on Optometric Education of the
American Optometric Association. Applicants approved to
participate in the program may be issued a loan equal to the
four-year cost of attendance based on in-state tuition and
required fees at the University of Alabama at Birmingham
School of Optometry.

"\$34-22-63.

"(a) Scholarships Annual loans extended under subdivision (1) of Section 34-22-62 shall be repaid following graduation, either in cash as is provided under subsection (b) in subdivision (1) or under terms of a contract to serve in a needy an area of need in Alabama for a term to be specified by

the board as provided in subsection (c) subdivision (2). Any moneys monies received from recipients in repayment of a scholarship loan under subsections (b) and (c) shall subdivision (1) or (2), upon receipt thereof, shall be retained by the Board of Optometric Scholarship and Loan Awards to be used for the funding of future scholarships awards and loans. The board shall establish a separate fund for these purposes.

"(1) (b) Scholarship Repayment of annual loans to be repaid under this subsection subdivision shall be repaid made to the Board of Optometric Scholarship Awards board in full at an interest rate determined by the board from the date of graduation from the optometry school, and payments are to be made annually according to terms established by the board, the first of which is due one year six months after the recipient enters the practice of optometry or one year after graduation from optometry school or the completion of residency training, whichever occurs first last. Repayment in full shall be completed within 12 eight years from initiation of repayment. Any recipient who fails for any reason to continue his or her optometric education or who fails to practice optometry in this state shall repay all loan amounts in accordance with terms and conditions established by the Board of Optometric Scholarship Awards board. The interest rate on such the unpaid loan amounts shall be determined by the Board of Optometric

- "(2) (c) Scholarship Repayment of annual loans to be repaid under this subsection subdivision shall be repaid made by service in one of the following ways, subject to approval by the Board of Optometric Scholarship Awards, board and considering the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare designated optometric manpower shortage areas as one means of determination most current Optometric Shortage Index:
- "(1) a. Practice for a four-year period in a community of less than 5,000 population which has been deemed to be critically in need of additional optometric practitioners.
- "(2) <u>b.</u> Practice for a five-year period in a community of more than 5,000 population and less than 15,000 population which has been deemed to be critically in need of additional optometric practitioners.
- "(3) c. Practice for a five-year period in a community of more than 15,000 but less than 100,000 population and repayment of one-half the loan plus an interest rate set by the Board of Optometric Scholarship Awards board to be repaid annually in five annual payments, beginning at the end of the first year of practice.
- "(4) <u>d.</u> Practice for four years in a position in Alabama in public health or as an optometrist in any state

1	institution approved by the <del>Board of Optometric Scholarship</del>
2	Awards board.
3	"e. Part-time service in an area of critical need
4	that is one of the top 50 percent of areas with the highest
5	rate under the most recent Optometric Shortage Index. The loan
6	recipient shall spend an average of 20 hours a week on an
7	annual basis practicing direct patient care in the designated
8	area to receive partial forgiveness up to 50 percent of his or
9	her annual loan amount.
10	" $\frac{(5)}{f}$ for loans of less than four years of study,
11	service repayment may be prorated on the basis of one-fourth
12	of the above requirements for each loan.
13	"(b)(1) Loans extended under subdivision (3) of
14	Section 34-22-62 shall be repaid under terms of a contract by
15	working in full-time clinical practice as a licensed
16	optometrist in an area of critical need, approved by the
17	board, for six years or as provided in subdivision (2). Each
18	optometrist participating in the Alabama Optometric Service
19	Program shall participate in the state Medicaid program under
20	the terms of the written contract.
21	"(2) If the participant can demonstrate to the
22	board's satisfaction that a qualifying percent of the
23	participant's active patients were indigent or covered by

Medicaid during the previous year, the participant shall

1	receive additional service credit based on the following
2	<pre>criteria:</pre>
3	"a. Three months if at least 20 percent of the
4	participant's active patients were indigent or covered by
5	Medicaid during the previous year.
6	"b. Six months if at least 30 percent of the
7	participant's active patients were indigent or covered by
8	Medicaid during the previous year.
9	"c. One year if at least 50 percent of the
10	participant's active patients were indigent or covered by
11	Medicaid during the previous year.
12	"(3) A participant in the program, subject to
13	approval by the board, may change the area of critical need
14	where he or she will work to repay loans under this program,
15	but in no case shall the participant work in a full-time
16	clinical practice for less than four years in the new area of
17	critical need.
18	"(4)a. An area of critical need shall be any area in
19	this state that is one of the top 30 percent of areas with the
20	highest rate under the most recent Optometric Shortage Index.
21	The board may also consider the percentage of practicing
22	optometrists in a county or shortage area that are over the
23	age of 65 in determining an area of critical need.
24	"b. The board may allow a participant in the Alabama

Optometric Service Program to serve part-time in an area of

critical need that is one of the top eight percent of areas
with the highest rate under the most recent Optometric

Shortage Index. The participant must spend an average of 20
hours per week on an annual basis practising direct patient
care in the designated area for a minimum of six years to
qualify for full forgiveness of the loan.

"\$34-22-64.

"(a) Each recipient of a scholarship loan under the provisions of this article shall enter into a contract with the Board of Optometric Scholarship and Loan Awards whereby he/she where the recipient agrees to repay the scholarship loan in a manner prescribed by the board not inconsistent with any provisions of this article. Breach of contract by the recipient shall make him/her the recipient immediately liable for the unpaid balance of the loan and shall constitute a ground for the revocation of his/her the recipient's certificate or license to practice optometry in the State of Alabama this state. In the event of death or total and permanent disability of the recipient to engage in the practice of optometry, repayment of the loan may be excused by the board.

"(b) If a breach of contract occurs prior to completion of the repayment obligations set forth in this article, a penalty equal to 100 percent of the remaining

L	principal	amount	of a	ll loans	received	by th	<u>e recipient</u>	shall

"(c) The Attorney General of Alabama, upon request of the Board of Optometric Scholarship and Loan Awards, shall institute proceedings in the name of the state for the purpose of recovering any amount due the state under the provisions of this article. All proceedings involving default or dispute of the contract shall be brought in the appropriate court of jurisdiction in Montgomery County. The proceedings to have such optometrists' an optometrist's certificate or license revoked shall be commenced upon the written complaint of the Board of Optometric Scholarship Awards board to the State Board of Optometric Examiners. The proceedings shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Alabama law pertaining to the revocation of licenses to practice optometry.

"(d) The board may pursue all means legally
available to it under the law to collect on outstanding
balances if a breach of contract occurs. Any monies received
from recipients in repayment or recovered by the board from
this section shall be retained by the board for the funding of
future scholarships and loans.

"\$34-22-65.

"(a) Any incorporated or unincorporated municipality or locality in the state having a population of less than 100,000 desiring additional optometrists and wishing to be

1	designated as a locality needing additional optometrists, may
2	apply to the Board of Optometric Scholarship and Loan Awards
3	to be placed on a list of localities in need of additional
4	optometrists, which list shall be maintained by the board.

"(b) Such An application may be made either by the municipal governing body or by a petition signed by at least one-twentieth of the qualified electors of the municipality or locality.

"(c) If the Board of Optometric Scholarship Awards
board determines that such a locality is in need of
optometrists, it shall place the locality on the list of
localities in need of optometrists from which recipients of
scholarship awards loans may upon graduation select an area in
which to practice. In compiling and maintaining the list, the
board may place any locality thereon which in its opinion
needs additional optometrists work to repay the loans with
service approved by the board under Section 34-22-63(c)."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
