20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. (a) The Legislature finds and declares
22	the following:
23	(1) That the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of
24	the United States of America defines the total scope of
25	federal power as being that specifically granted by the United
2.6	States Constitution and no more.

1 (2) That the Tenth Amendment guarantees and reserves 2 to the states all powers not delegated to the federal 3 government.

- (3) That the United States Supreme Court in New York v. United States, 505 U.S. 144 (1992), confirmed that Congress may not commandeer the legislative and regulatory processes of the state.
- (4) That the United States Supreme Court in Printz v. United States, 521 U.S. 898 (1997), reaffirmed that the Constitution of the United States established a system of "dual sovereignty" that retains "a residuary and inviolable sovereignty" by the states.
- (5) That under the Tenth Amendment, the people and State of Alabama retain their exclusive power to regulate the State of Alabama, subject only to the Fourteenth Amendment's guarantee that the people and State of Alabama shall exercise such sovereign power in accordance with each citizen's lawful privileges and immunities, and in compliance with the requirements of due process and equal protections of the law.
- (6) That it is the duty of the Alabama Legislature to adopt and enact any and all measures that may become necessary to prevent the wrongful enforcement of any federal laws or regulations that infringe on the State of Alabama's sovereignty within the boundaries and limits of this state.
- (b) The Legislature further declares that the State of Alabama claims sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment to the United States Constitution over all powers not otherwise

enumerated and granted to the federal government by the United

States Constitution.

(c) This section shall serve as a notice and demand to the federal government to cease and desist any and all activities outside the scope of its constitutionally enumerated powers and any attempt to diminish the balance of powers as established. Congress and the federal government are hereby prohibited from exercising any purported additional control over, or from commandeering rights belonging to, the State of Alabama or its people.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
