22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. (a) No provision of the state building code

Section 1. (a) No provision of the state building code, or any municipal or county building code, or any other law or rule, may prohibit or otherwise limit the use of a substitute refrigerant or substitute refrigerant-equipped product that complies with the National Clean Air Act pursuant to 42 U.S.C.

29	(b) Any heating, ventilation, air conditioning, or
30	refrigeration equipment containing a refrigerant described in
31	subsection (a) shall be listed and installed in accordance
32	with all applicable safety standards and use conditions
33	imposed pursuant to the designation.
34	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
35	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
36	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
